SATURDAY, January 1, 1820.

The house met. Present the same members as on yesterday. The proceedings of yesterday were read. The bill for the relief of Ann Branson and Ally Buckler, of Saint Mary's county; the resolution in favour of the witnesses attending, relative to the Calvert election; and the resolution relative to an appropriation to furnish the government house, were sent to the senate.

Mr T. W. Hall presents a petition from Richard Foggett, a revolutionary soldier; which was read and referred to the committee on pensions and revolutionary claims.

Mr. Montgomery presents petitions from the Phoenix Fire Insurance Company, the Maryland Insurance Company, and the Chesapeake Insurance Company, praying a continuance of their charters, which were read and referred to the committee appointed on the petition of the Union Insurance Company.

Mr. W. R. Stuart presents a petition from the trustees of Union Academy of Queen Anne's county, praying for a portion of the school fund; which was read and referred to Messrs. W. R. Stuart, Hollingsworth and Nicholson.

Mr. Montgomery presents a petition from the president, directors and stockholders, of the Baltimore Water Company, praying for a repeal of so much of the seventh section of their charter as requires ratification, by a majority of stockholders of conveyances and transfers, made by the president and directors; which was read and referred to the committee appointed on the petition of the Union Insurance Company.

Mr. Lecompte presents a report from the Cambridge Academy; which was read.

Mr. Montgomery presents a petition from the president of the Cumberland Turnpike Road, praying some effectual means may be taken to complete the connection between the said road and the Frederick road at Boonsborough; which was read and referred to Messrs. Montgomery, Tomlinson and Breckenridge.

Mr. Tomlinson presents a petition from the heirs of Edmund Boyd of Allegany county, praying they may hold real property as if they were naturalized; which was read and referred to Messrs. Tomlinson, Blair and Greenwell.

Mr. Quinton delivers a bill, entitled, An act for keeping in repair the public roads in Worcester county, and to repeal certain parts of the acts of assembly therein mentioned, which was read.

The bill to prevent the erection of booths within two miles of any methodist camp or quarterly meeting in Harford county, was read the second time, passed and sent to the senate.

The bill to make null and void the deed and contract therein mentioned, was read the second time and will not pass.

On motion by Mr. A. Spence, Leave given to bring in a bill, entitled, An act authorising special courts of Oyer and Terminer, and for other purposes. Ordered, That Messrs. A. Spence, Hayward and Lecompte, prepare and bring in the same.

On motion by Mr. Dorsey, Ordered, That the bill to regulate sales by public auction, have a second reading on Thursday next

On motion by Mr. Lecompte, Ordered, That the resolution relative to the admission of new states into the union. have a second reading on Wednesday next.

The bill for the relief of the infant legatees of Jacob Franklin, and the additional supplement to the act, entitled, An act for founding an academy at Hager's-town in Washington county, were read the second time, passed, and sent to the senate.

The clerk of the senate delivers the bill authorising Richard Moffitt to complete his collections; the supplement to the act for the benefit of the heirs of John Thomas; the supplement to the act to incorporate a company for the purpose of building a bridge over the river Susquehanna; the bill for the benefit of the Reformed and Evangelical Lutheran Church on Silver Run, Frederick county, called St. Mary's Church; and the bill for the benefit of Wilson Carey Seldon, severally endorsed "will pass." Ordered to be engrossed. The bill for the relief of Lambert W. Ford, James Christie and Edmond Brown, Cecil county, and the bill to incorporate the trustees of a Methodist meeting house in Queen Anne's county, and for other purposes, severally endorsed "will not pass." And the bill to incorporate certain persons therein named for the purpose of establishing a free school called M. Kim's School, in the city of Baltimore, endorsed "will pass with the proposed amendments," which amendments were read. And the resolution in favour of the witnesses attending relative to the Calvert election, and the resolution relative to an appropriation to furnish the government house, severally endorsed "assented to."

On the second reading of the bill to protect the right of property in corn, tobacco, and in other things adhering to the freehold, on motion by Mr. Key, That the following be inserted after the words "or so taking away" in the first clause, to wit, "shall upon conviction thereof, at the discretion of the court, forfeit and pay a sum not exceeding \$100 for every such offence, or undergo a confinement and labour in the penitentiary of this state for a term not more than five years." A division was called for and put on the first part thereof, as far as the word "offence?" Resolved in the affirmative.

The question was then put, That the house assent to the residue of the amendment. Resolved in the affirmative.
