

MONDAY, January 10, 1820.

The house met. Present the same members as on Saturday. The proceedings of Saturday were read. The supplement to an act relating to insolvent debtors in the city and county of Baltimore, and the supplement to the act, entitled, An act to restrain the evil practices, arising from negroes keeping dogs, and to prohibit them from carrying guns or offensive weapons, so far as the same relates to Harford county, were sent to the senate.

Mr. Kennedy delivers a petition from Jacob Knight, and Mr. J. F. Browne presents a petition from Samuel Davis, both revolutionary soldiers; which were read, and referred to the committee on pensions and revolutionary claims.

The resolution in favour of Bean S. Pigman, was read the second time, assented to, and sent to the senate.

On motion by Mr. Stevens, Leave given to bring in a bill, entitled, An act to authorise John Stevens, late collector of Talbot county, to complete his collection. Ordered, That Messrs. Stevens, N. Martin and D. Martin, report the same.

Mr. Stonestreet presents a petition from Margaret W. Nailor, praying for a divorce; which was read and referred to Messrs. Stonestreet, Jenifer and Dorsey

Mr. Kennedy reports a bill, entitled, An act authorising and directing the levy court of Washington county to levy and assess a sum of money for the support of a foundling child; Mr. Ross reports a bill, entitled, An act for the benefit of All-Saints Church in Frederick town, Frederick county; and Mr. Kennedy reports a bill, entitled, An act for the relief of Thomas Russell, a free black man, of Washington county; which were severally read.

The supplement to the act, entitled, An act for laying out and opening a road in Harford county, was read the second time, passed, and sent to the senate.

The resolution rescinding the resolution in favour of Joshua Rutledge, was read the second time, assented to, and sent to the senate.

Mr. Ross presents a petition from John M. Pherson, and others, managers of a lottery, praying to be released from the five per cent. thereon; which was read and referred to Messrs. Ross, Hawkins, Iiams, Stonestreet and Harrison.

The report in favour of Thomas S. Loveday, was read the second time, the resolution therein assented to, and sent to the senate.

The speaker laid before the house a report from the clerk of Frederick county, relative to the attendance of judges; which was read and referred to the committee of grievances and courts of justice.

The report relative to the Colonization Society, was read the second time, the resolution therein contained assented to, and sent to the senate

On motion by Mr. Jenifer the following resolution was read:

Resolved, That the treasurer of the western shore of Maryland, be and he is hereby authorised, to give a draft on the general government, in favour of the managers of the American Colonization Society, for the sum of — dollars, to be paid out of the state of Maryland's claim against the United States, to be applied to the promotion of the objects of the said society.

And on motion by Mr. Jenifer, the question was put, That the blank therein be filled up with the words "five thousand dollars?" Determined in the negative.

On motion by Mr. Jenifer, the question was put on \$2000? Determined in the negative.

The bill to authorise Thomas A. Davis, to complete his collection; and the bill for the benefit of Elizabeth Howard, were severally read the second time, passed, and sent to the senate.

The clerk of the senate delivers the resolution in favour of Henry Darden, endorsed "dissented from."

On motion by Mr. Maulsby, the following resolution was read.

Resolved, That all proceedings against Benjamin G. Jones, late sheriff of Harford county, and his securities, on judgments obtained by the state against them, be and the same are hereby suspended until the first day of January next, and that the nine per cent additional interest chargeable thereon, be and the same is hereby released, provided the principal and six per cent. interest shall be paid within one year from the passage of this resolution.

The resolution in favour of John Taylor, was read the second time, assented to, and sent to the senate.

On motion by Mr. Montgomery, Leave given to bring in a bill, entitled, An act relating to the city court. Ordered, That Messrs. Montgomery, Breckenridge and Maulsby, report the same.

The speaker laid before the house a report from the Hagers-town academy; which was read.

Mr. Saulsbury reports a bill, entitled, An act for the benefit of Arabella Bayard of Caroline county; Mr. Montgomery reports a bill, entitled, An act annulling the marriage of Elizabeth Kreager of the city of Baltimore; Mr. Stevens reports a bill, entitled, An act to authorise John Stevens, the elder, late collector of Talbot county, to complete his collection; and Mr. Breckenridge reports a bill, entitled, An act for the relief of Margaret Danskin, of the city of Baltimore; which were severally read.

Mr. Montgomery presents a report from the Commercial and Farmers Bank; which was read and referred to the committee appointed on that subject.
