The report in favour of William Ritchie and Ezra Mantz, was read the second time, and on motion by Mr. Montgomery, the further consideration of the same was postponed until to-morrow.

On motion by Mr. Boyle, Ordered, That John Gray and Isaac Simmons, be and they are hereby charged from further attendance as witnesses on this house.

The clerk of the senate delivers the bill for the relief of James Bowers, and the bill to alter the time holding the county court of Charles county, severally endorsed "will pass." Ordered to be engrossed. The bill annulling the marriage of Thomas F. Ward and Ann Ward, of Saint-Mary's county; the bill to incorporate the Skipton Turnpike Company; the further supplement to an act, entitled, An act to incorporate a bank under the title of 'The Planters' Bank of Prince-George's county; and the supplement to an act for the better protection of slaveholders in the several counties therein mentioned, severally endorsed, "will pass with the proposed amendments;" which amendments were read, assented to, and bills ordered to be engrossed. The supplement to an act, entitled, An act relating to insolvent debtors of the city of Baltimore, endorsed "will pass with the proposed amendments;" which amendments were read.
