

Mr. Stonestreet reports the said bill; which was read the first and second time by special order, passed, and sent to the senate.

The clerk of the senate delivers the supplement to the act, entitled, An act for the benefit of the University of Maryland, endorsed "will pass with the proposed amendments;" which amendments were read, assented to, and the bill ordered to be engrossed.

The bill for the revaluation of the real and personal property in Charles county, was read the second time, and on motion by Mr. Lucas, so amended as to include Dorchester county. The bill was then passed and sent to the senate.

Mr. Duvall delivers the following report:

The committee to whom was referred the communication of the executive, relative to the resolution from the state of Indiana, have had the subject under consideration, and recommend the adoption of the following resolution:

Resolved, by the general assembly of Maryland, that they do concur in the amendment to the constitution of the United States proposed to the consideration of the several states by the state of Pennsylvania, which is as follows, to wit: "Congress shall make no law to erect or incorporate any bank, or other monied institution, except within the district of Columbia, and every bank, or other monied institution, which shall be established by the authority of Congress, shall, together with its branches, and offices of discount and deposit, be confined to the district of Columbia."

Resolved, That our senators and representatives in congress be requested to use their exertions to procure the adoption of the foregoing amendment.

Resolved, That the governor of this state be requested to transmit copies of the foregoing proposed amendment and resolutions, to each of our senators and our representatives in congress, and also to the executives of the several states, with a request that they lay the same before the legislatures thereof, soliciting their co-operation in procuring the adoption of the foregoing amendment. All of which is submitted.

Which was read.

Mr. Kennedy reports a bill, entitled, An act providing for the support of persons imprisoned for debt in certain cases; Mr. Stevens reports a bill, entitled, A supplement to the act, entitled, An act to incorporate a company to make a turnpike road leading to Cumberland, and for the extension of the charters of the several banks in the city of Baltimore; which were read.

The supplement to the act for the establishment and regulation of the levy courts in the several counties of this state, and the bill for the relief of John Carey, of Worcester county, were read the second time, passed, and sent to the senate.

The bill to repeal the act therein mentioned, was read the second time, and on motion by Mr. W. R. Stuart, the further consideration of the same was postponed until to-morrow:

The additional supplement to an act, entitled, An act to alter and change the name of Elizabeth-town, in Washington county, to Hagers-town, and to incorporate the same; and the bill to alter the time of holding the county court in Somerset county, were read the second time and will not pass.

The clerk of the senate delivers the supplement to an act, entitled, An act for the distribution of a certain school fund for the purpose of establishing free schools in the several counties therein mentioned, endorsed "will pass with the proposed amendment;" which amendment was read. Messrs. Howard and Jackson are appointed on the part of the senate, to join the gentlemen who may be named on the part of your house, to count the ballots and report thereon.

For the Branch of the Farmers Bank of Maryland at Easton, Lambert Clayland and Lambert Reardon, were elected. For the Hager's Town Bank, John Buchanan and Daniel Schnebly were elected; and for the Elkton Bank, George Beaston was elected.

Whereupon Resolved, That William Pinkney, Jr. William Stansbury, William Stewart, Tobias E. Stansbury, Upton Bruce, John Barney, William Kilty, Nicholas Brewer, Lambert Clayland, Lambert Reardon, John Buchanan, Daniel Schnebly and George Beaston, be, and they are hereby declared to be, directors on the part of this state for the ensuing year, in the banks aforesaid.
