This nouse have dissented from your amendments to the bill, entitled, A supplement to an act, entiled, An act for the distribution of a certain fund for the purpose of establishing free schools in the seeral counties therein named, and hope, on reconsideration, you will recede from the amendments. Whereas, from the official reports of the treasurer, and the report of the committee of ways and m ans predicated thereon, and from information derived from the states' agent alluded to in the report of the aid committee, it appears that in the event of the receipt from the general government of a portion of he states' claim, the whole of the loans of the state, reimbursable in the year 1820, and the current exbenses of the year, together with the amount of the journals in 1821, can be discharged, and leave a be ance n the treasury; and in the event of the receipt of no part of the states' claim against the general governnent, yet the receipts in the treasury, with the balance of spece thereon, will enable the state to disharge as well the current expenses of the year, and the journals of the next session, as one moiety of aid loans, and leave a balance in the treasury. And whereas the city of Baltimore, under their charter olicence and regulate auctions, and by the ordinance passed in conformity thereto, have since the pasing of said ordinance, received a fund of one per cent on goods sold at public auction, which lund has een faithfully applied and expended, and still continues to be so applied, in cleansing and deepening the pason, a measure not only of immense importance to the city, but to the state at large. And whereas he city of Baltimore is bur hened with a debt, including the war debt, to the amount of nearly half a milion of dollars, and is struggling under the effects of numerous combined difficultie, and the unprecelented pressure of the times, and has recently experienced a most afflicting visitation of providence: And whereas the state of the treasury does not require a direct tax on the assessable property of the tate, and the annual receipts will meet the current expenses, therefor e. Ordered by this house, as an apression of their opinion, that it is inexpedient to pass a law, (and so the house have decided,) directly rindirectly diminishing or taking away this source of revenue from the city of Baltimore, and that the overnor and council be requested to publish the aforegoing in the several newspapers at Easton, Freerick, Hager's town. Annapolis and Baltimore.
