Mr. Montgomery presents the following report:

The committee to whom was referred the memorial of the judges, the bar, and city jurors, of Baltimore county court, Report—that they have had the same under their most serious consideration, and are of opinion that the change in the time of holding the court to April, as prayed for in said memorial would be inconvenient and injurious to the suitors, jurors and witnesses, attending from the county; and the change to December, as prayed for, unless the change to April was made, would bring the December term too near to March term, besides the court by adjournment of the September term to December, would obtain the object of holding court in December, if it is very desirable, than to hold court, without legislative provisions. The clashing of the courts of the United States, with Baltimore county court perhaps might be remedied more conveniently by the times of holding the United States court being altered, than by changing those of the Baltimore county court, which change in the United States court is presumed could with facility be obtained by the senators and representatives in congress from Maryland. The committee are therefore of opinion, that it is not expedient to grant the prayer of the petitioners. All which is submitted.
