The committee of grievances and courts of justice to whom was referred that part of the governor's communication relative to the act providing for the increase of the revenue of this state, by laying a tax on brokers and lottery office keepers, report—that they have had the same under their consideration, and beg leave to submit the following resolution:

Resolved, That the governor and council, be and they are hereby requested to direct the district attorney for Baltimore city court, to take immediately such legal measures as he shall deem necessary, to enforce the execution of the provisions of the act, entitled, An act providing for the increase of the revenue of this state, by laying a tax on brokers and lottery office keepers.

The supplement to the act to incorporate the Elkton Academy, was read the second time and will not pass.
