

the ordinary expenses of the state, and the extraordinary expenses of the war," from the amount of receipts into the treasury since the years 1812 to 1819, there is the amount of \$184,000 unaccounted for: And whereas it is important that the people should know in what manner this money has been expended; in order that they may judge of its propriety—therefore, Ordered, That the treasurer be directed to report immediately in what manner, and by virtue of what resolutions the said money has been expended.

The resolution in favour of John Staples was read the second time, assented to, and sent to the senate. The committee to whom was referred the petition of Charles Gibson, register of the land office for the Eastern shore, beg leave to report—that by a memorial of the register of the western shore, presented to this house, they find that the certificates of surveys of lands made on the eastern shore prior to the first day of March 1796, are mingled and combined on record with those on the western shore, and cannot be separated without having them transcribed; therefore they are of opinion, it is not expedient at this time to grant the prayer of the petitioner, they therefore recommend that he have leave to withdraw his petition. All of which is submitted.

Whereas it appears by a report transmitted to the legislature by the executive, that there was due to Alembry Jump, Esq. agent for the collection of public arms on the eastern shore, the sum of three hundred and eighty three dollars, for collecting and delivering to the armourer at Easton four hundred and thirty muskets, &c. which remained unpaid in consequence of the want of funds; therefore

Resolved, That the governor and council be and they are hereby authorised and requested, to draw an order on the treasurer of the western shore for the aforesaid sum, and the said treasurer is directed to pay the same out of any unappropriated money in the treasury.

The amendment to the resolution relative to the government house, were read the second time and assented to.

The resolution relative to Hillsborough School, was read the second time, and the question put, That the house assent to the same? Resolved in the affirmative.

On motion by Mr. Duvall, The following order was read:

Ordered, That the committee of claims allow Thomas Pollard on the journal of accounts, the sum of fifty dollars, as a further remuneration for his extra services during the present session as a committee and engrossing clerk.

On motion by Mr. Dorsey, the question was put, That "Ivin Spence" be inserted after Thomas Pollard? Determined in the negative.

The question was then put, That the house assent to the same? Resolved in the affirmative.

On motion by Mr. Dennis, the following resolution was read:

Resolved, That the governor and council be and they are hereby authorised and empowered, to examine into the claims of Benjamin Pindell and Alembry Jump, agents appointed for the collection of the public arms, camp equipage, &c. and allow each of them such sum as may respectively appear due, and draw on the treasurer of the western shore for the payment of the same.

The resolution in favour of Benjamin Greentree, was read the second time, assented to, and sent to the senate.
