

VOTES AND PROCEEDINGS

On motion by Mr. Maulsby, Ordered, That the communications from the treasurer and trustee of the state be referred to the committee of claims, and that the reports of the clerks relative to the attendance of the judges be referred to the committee of grievances and courts of justice.

Mr. Barney reports a bill, entitled, An act to incorporate the trustees of M. Kim's school in the city of Baltimore; which was read

On motion by Mr. Stoddert, Leave given to bring in a bill, entitled, A supplement to the act, entitled, An act relating to negroes, and to repeal the acts of assembly therein mentioned, passed at November session 1796. Ordered, That Messrs Stoddert, Marriott, Maulsby, Dennis and Key, prepare and bring in the same.

On motion by Mr. J. P. Kennedy, the following order was read: Ordered, That the committee of claims be directed to furnish this house with one copy of the latest Philadelphia edition of Bacon's Abridgement, and that the same be allowed on the journal of accounts.

FRIDAY, December 8, 1820.

The house met. Present the same members as on yesterday. The proceedings of yesterday were read. Frederick Holbrook, Esquire, a delegate returned for Caroline county, appeared, qualified, and took his seat

On motion by Mr. Stoddert, the following order was read: Ordered, That so much of the executive communications as relates to the arms which still want cleaning and repairs, be referred to a committee of five.

That so much as relates to the claims of this state upon the general government, be referred to a committee of seven.

That so much as relates to the still further promotion of education among the indigent children of this state, be referred to a committee of seven

That so much as relates to internal improvements, be referred to a committee of seven.

That so much as relates to the loans made to the state, be referred to the committee of ways and means.

Mr. Polk presents a petition from the Nanticoke Bridge Company, praying that a part of the 9th section of the law incorporating them may be repealed; which was read and referred to Messrs. Polk, Lake and Willis.

Mr. Alderson presents a petition from sundry inhabitants of Harford county, praying for the repeal of the resolution giving Joshua Rutledge a pension; which was read and referred to the committee on pensions and revolutionary claims.

Mr. Edelen presents a petition from Burdit Posey, of Charles county, praying a deed from John Posey to him may be made valid; which was read and referred to Messrs. Edelen, Stoddert and Posey.

Mr. Posey presents petitions from sundry inhabitants of Charles county, praying that tolls for grinding grain may be increased, which were read and referred to Messrs. Posey, Rogerson, Stoddert, Key and Weem.

Mr. Edelen presents a petition from sundry inhabitants of Charles county, praying for the increase of toll at Gay's mill; which was read and referred to Messrs. Edelen, Posey and Rogerson.

On motion by Mr. Stoddert, Leave given to bring in a bill, entitled, An act to provide for the collection and payment over of forfeited recognizances. Ordered, That Messrs. Stoddert, Wilson, J. Forrest, Ke and Gaither, prepare and bring in the same.

On motion by Mr. Bowles, the following resolution was read, assented to, and sent to the senate.

Resolved, That the treasurer of the western shore pay to the several members of the general assembly, and the officers thereof, also to the electors of the president of the United States, the amount of the several sums due to them, and for which they shall obtain certificates from the chairman of the committee of claims.

Mr. B. S. Forrest presents a petition from Joseph Delaplane, of Montgomery county, praying a special act of insolvency; which was read and referred to Messrs. B. S. Forrest, M. Pherson and Gaither.

Mr. Maulsby presents a petition from Nathen Garretson and Jacob W. Giles, praying that a deed from said Giles to Garretson may be made valid, which was read and referred to Messrs. Maulsby, Norris and Alderson.

Mr. Darne presents petitions from Elizabeth Gordon, Elizabeth Kisby and Mary Taylor, of Montgomery county, each praying a pension, in consequence of the revolutionary services of their deceased husbands; which were read and referred to the committee on pensions and revolutionary claims.
