Resolver in the affirmative.

Mr Marriott presents a petition from Robert W Kent, of Anne Arundel county, praying permission, to remove slaves into this state; which was read and referred to Messrs Marriott, Wyvill and T W. Hall. On motion by Mr Boyle, the following message was read, assented to, and sent to the senate: BY THE H USE OF DELEGATES, December .3, 1820.

Centlemen of the Senate,

Yesterday a message was forwarded by this house, to the honourable the senate, informing that we were prepared to proceed to the election of a register of wills for Anne Arundel county at half past on o'clock P. M. It was the ultimate design of this branch of the general assembly to have gone into the election of registers of wills for the several counties, wherein vacancies had occurred during the recess, as speedily as possible, and had commenced this business by requesting your body to go into the election for one of those counties on vesterday. The house of delegates continued in session until long atterthe hour appointed, and received no answer to the message which had been sent, which was on your parts tacit declension of the contemplated choice. It is with regret that we again call the attention of the senate to a subject of so much importance. By the constitution of this state it is declared, "that there bea register of wills appointed for each county, who shall be commissioned by the governor, on the joint recommendation of the sena e and house of delegates, and that upon the death, resignation disqualification, or removal out of the co-ntv by any register of wills in the recess of the general assembly the governor with the advice of the council may appoint and commission a fit and proper person to such we cant office, to hold the same until the meeting of the general assembly." It is with regret that the house of delegates have discovered a disinclination on your part to proceed to a joint recommendation of some person to fill the vacancy which has occurred in the office of register of wills or Anne Arundel county. Under the powers vested in the executive, by the constitution, appointments have been made, but these nate must be sensible that these appointments ceased with othe meeting of the general assembly?

Deeming this a subject of the most important concern to the good people of this state, we have though it necessary to call your attention once more to it. The register of wills for Anne-Arundel county is not only the keeper of the county records, but the conservator of the records of the late prerogative of fice. in which office are carefully preserved all the last wills and testaments down to the period of the

revolution, with many other important papers and documen's.

This then is not an appointment of mere locality, but of general interest and concern In consequence of this appointment not being made, administration, testamentary, and guardians bonds, may be running out of date, and some important ejectment cause, in some of the counties, lost or postponed for want & a will to complete the title

We know of no reason for its postponement; every member of each house is attending at the seat of government, and we hope that the senate will, on reflection, consent to a joint recommendation of some person to the governor, to be commissioned as register of wills for Anne Arundel county The house delegates therefore propose to the senate, immediately to ballot for some person to be jointly recommend
