

On motion by Mr. Hayward, Leave given to bring in a bill, entitled, An act to enable Robert Lambden, of William, late collector of Talbot county, to complete his collections. Ordered, That Messrs. Hayward, S. Stevens, and N. Martin, report the same.

The bill for the benefit of Thomas Ennalls Price, of Talbot county, was read the second time, passed, and sent to the senate.

Mr. T. Kennedy presents petitions from sundry inhabitants of Washington county, praying a confirmation of an act passed at December session 1819, relative to an election district; which were read and referred to Messrs. T. Kennedy, Bowles and Gabby. Also a petition from Richard Hazlip; which was read and referred to the committee on pensions and revolutionary claims. And petitions from Samuel Castle and Charles Hutchinson, of Washington county, each praying a special act of insolvency; which were read and referred to Messrs. Kennedy, Bowles and Kershner.

Mr. J. P. Kennedy presents a memorial from the president and managers of the Maryland penitentiary, praying that the legislature will provide for the immediate liquidation of the debt due by them, and authorise the application of the future profits of the house to the building of an east wing; which was read and referred to Messrs. J. P. Kennedy, Maulsby, Boyle, Alderson, Hayward and J. Forrest.

Mr. J. Forrest presents a petition from Robert R. Richardson, executor of Thomas Richardson, praying for a sale of part of the real estate of the said testator; which was read and referred to Messrs. J. Forrest, Barney and R. Hall.

Mr. Barney presents a petition from the trustees of the Roman Catholic Congregation in the town of Baltimore, praying for a modification of their charter; which was read and referred to Messrs. Barney, Dennis, J. P. Kennedy, Posey and Harding.

Mr. J. P. Kennedy, presents a petition from Moses Sheppard, of the city of Baltimore, praying he may be authorised to build a warehouse for the inspection of tobacco; which was read and referred to Messrs. J. P. Kennedy, Barney and B. Forrest.

On motion by Mr. J. P. Kennedy, Leave given to bring in a bill, entitled, An act to abolish imprisonment for debt in the state of Maryland. Ordered, That Messrs. J. P. Kennedy, Darnes, Boyle, Maulsby, B. Forrest, Polk and Wilson, report the same.

Mr. Bowles reports a bill, entitled, A further supplement to the act, entitled, An act for the erection of a new market house in Hagers-town, Washington county. And Mr. Hayward reports a bill, entitled, An act for the benefit of James Ridgaway; which were read.

On motion by Mr. Maulsby, the following resolution was read.

Resolved, That all proceedings against Benjamin G. Jones, late sheriff of Harford county, and his securities, on judgments obtained by the state against them, be and the same are hereby suspended until the first day of November next, and that the nine per cent additional interest chargeable thereon, be and the same is hereby released, provided the principal and six per cent interest shall be paid on or before the first day of said November.

The bill for the relief of John J. Moore, of Harrison county, state of Ohio, was read the second time, passed, and sent to the senate.

Mr. Marriott presents a petition from Elizabeth Purdy, of Anne-Arundel county; which was read and referred to the committee on out pensions.

Mr. King reports a bill, entitled, A supplement to an act, entitled, An act to increase the pay of the judges of the orphans court for the several counties therein mentioned; which was read.

The bill, entitled, An act to repeal part of an act therein mentioned, was read the second time, passed, and sent to the senate.

Mr. W. Eccleston reports a bill, entitled, An act to change the time of holding the levy court in Dorchester county; which was twice read, passed, and sent to the senate.

On motion by Mr. J. P. Kennedy, Leave given to bring in a bill, entitled, An act to repeal such parts of an act, entitled, An act to regulate lotteries, as relate to the commissioners of lotteries, and for other purposes. Ordered that Messrs. J. P. Kennedy, Maulsby and Duvall, report the same.

Mr. Polk reports a bill, entitled, An act for establishing the titles and bounds of lands, and for other purposes; which was read.

On motion by Mr. Boyle, the following order was read and assented to. Ordered, That the printer to this house deliver to the messenger of the council for the use of the governor and council, five copies of all bills, resolutions, orders, reports and documents, of a public nature, which shall be printed by order of this house.

On motion by Mr. J. B. Eccleston, Leave given to bring in a bill, entitled, An act to alter such parts of the constitution and form of government as relate to the manner of altering and changing the constitution and form of government of this state. Ordered, That Messrs. J. B. Eccleston, Dennis and Maulsby, report the same.

Mr. Dennis presents a petition from Jesse Hughes, of Somerset county, praying that patent may issue to him from the eastern shore land office for a tract called The Verdant Retreat; which was read and referred to Messrs. Dennis, Dashiell and King.

On motion by Mr. Polk, Leave given to bring in a bill, entitled, An act to alter such parts of the constitution and form of government as directs two delegates to be elected in the city of Baltimore as members of the general assembly, and such parts thereof as prescribe the manner of choosing the senate and of filling their vacancies. Ordered, That Messrs. Polk, J. P. Kennedy and J. Forrest, report the same.

Mr. J. Forrest reports a bill, entitled, An act to provide for the payment of the Jurors in Prince George's county; which was read.

Mr. Dennis reports a bill, entitled, An act for the relief of Jesse Hughes, respecting certain lands therein mentioned; which was twice read, and passed.

The clerk of the senate delivers a bill for the relief of John J. Moore, of Harrison county, state of Ohio; the bill to authorise William Jordan, late collector of the sixth collection district of Baltimore county, to complete his collection; the bill for the relief of David Waggaman; the bill authorising the levy court of Dorchester county, to levy a sum of money for the purposes therein mentioned; the bill authorising Henry E. Coalman to remove a certain negro slave into this state, severally endorsed, "will pass." Ordered, to be engrossed. The bill annulling the marriage of Thomas Knock, endorsed, "will not pass."
