Mr J P Kennedy reports a bill, entitled, An act authorising the sale within this state, of a limited number of tickets in the lottery, authorised by an act of the legislature of Pennsylvania, entitled, An act to enable George Murray, Gideon Fairman, John Draper, Robert Bald, and Thomas Underwood, co-partners in the firm of Murray, Fairman, and Co engravers in the city of Philadelphia, to dispose of certain books, maps, plates and prints, by way of lottery; which was read.

The clerk to the council, delivers a communication from the executive, informing the house that the claim of the state for military expenditures during the late war, has been passed to the amount of ninety-four thousand seven hundred and ten dollars and twenty one cents; which was read.

Mr J S Moffitt reports a bill, entitled, An act for the relief of Thomas Cole of Cecil county; which was read.

The bill to prevent swine and geese from going at large in Middle-town, in Frederick county, was read the second time and passed.

Mr J. B. Eccleston presents a petition from John Glenville, praying a pension in consequence of wounds received in the late war while under command of col. Reid; which was read and referred to Messrs. J. B. Eccleston, Maulsby and Barney.
