

The bill authorising the levy court of Prince-George's county to levy a sum of money for the purposes therein mentioned; and the bill for the relief of Catharine M-Kiernan, were read the second time, passed, and sent to the senate.

On motion by Mr. Duvall, Leave given to bring in a bill, entitled, An act authorising the levy court of Anne-Arundel county to discontinue out pensions, and for other purposes. Ordered, That Messrs. Duvall, T. W. Hall and Wyvill, report the same.

Mr. M-Pherson presents a petition from Peter Coblents, and others, praying a lottery for the benefit of the German Reformed Congregation; which was read and referred to Messrs. M-Pherson, Warfield and Cockey.

And a petition from Thomas Harris, of Frederick county, praying a special act of insolvency; which was read and referred to Messrs. M-Pherson, Cockey and Davis.

On motion by Mr. Marriott, Ordered, That the petition of James C Dew be referred to Messrs. Marriott, S Stevens and Dennis.

Mr. S. Stevens reports a bill, entitled, An act to authorise William Ferguson, late collector of Talbot county, to complete his collection; which was read.

On the second reading of the message relative to registers of wills, on motion by Mr. Hayward, the question was put, That the same be postponed until Tuesday next? Resolved in the affirmative.

The bill for the relief of the sheriffs and collectors of the several counties in this state, was read the second time, and on motion by Mr J B Eccleston, was referred to Messrs. J B Eccleston, Maulsby and Key.

The resolution in favour of Doctor M-Kenzie was read the second time, assented to, and sent to the senate.

On motion by Mr. Barney, the following message was read, assented to, and with the bill therein mentioned sent to the senate.

The bill for the benefit of Samuel Castle, of Washington county, was read the second time, passed, and sent to the senate.

The bill for the relief of Elizabeth Everett, of Baltimore county, was read the second time, passed, and sent to the senate.

The bill for the relief of Philo D Forrest of the city of Baltimore, was read the second time and passed.

The resolution in favour of the armourer, was read the second time and assented to.

Mr J B Eccleston reports the bill for the relief of the sheriffs and collectors of the several counties in this state, with amendments; which were read.

The bill for the relief of Charles Hutchinson, was read the second time and passed.

The bill to lay out and make public two roads therein mentioned in Cecil county, was read the second time and passed.

Mr. Cockey presents a petition a petition from negro Ann, of Frederick county, praying that a deed of manumission from Elias T rasher in her favour, may be made valid; which was read and referred to Messrs. Cockey, Maulsby and Wilson.

The bill for the relief of Benjamin Rawlings, of the city of Baltimore, was read the second time, passed, and sent to the senate.

On motion by Mr T Kennedy Ordered, That the bill for the benefit of the First Independent Church of Baltimore, have a second reading on Tuesday week next.
