

The bill to facilitate the collection of the county charges in Dorchester county, was read the second time, passed, and sent to the senate.

On motion by Mr. Millard, Leave given to bring in a bill, entitled, An act to alter and amend the road law so far as respects Saint Mary's county. Ordered, That Messrs Millard, Plater and Key, report the same.

The bill to authorise James Stevens, and Mary Ann, alias Anna Maria, his wife, to lease the lot or parcel of ground therein mentioned, and the bill authorising Letitia Rochester to convey the lands therein mentioned, and for other purposes, were read the second time, passed, and sent to the senate.

Mr. M-Pherson reports a bill, entitled, An act for the relief of Thomas Harris of Frederick county; which was read.

Mr. Warfield presents a petition from Willoughby Maybury, of Frederick county, praying a special act of insolvency; which was read and referred to Messrs Warfield, J. B. Eccleston and M-Pherson.

The clerk of the senate delivers the supplement to an act, entitled, An act to establish a bank in the city of Baltimore, and to an act to incorporate a company to make a turnpike road leading from Cumberland, and for the extension of the charters of the several banks in the city of Baltimore, and for other purposes; endorsed, "will pass with the proposed amendments;" which amendments were read, assented to, and the bill ordered to be engrossed.

The supplement to an act, entitled, An act relating to the police of the city of Baltimore, was read the second time and will not pass. The bill was returned to the senate.

On motion by Mr. Barney, Leave given to bring in a bill, entitled, An act relative to female minors. Ordered, That Messrs Barney, B. S. Forrest and J. P. Kennedy, report the same.

Mr. Barney reports the said bill; which was read.

Mr. R. Stevens presents a petition from sundry inhabitants of Kent and Queen-Anne's county, praying that the draw in the bridge over Chesler river may be put in the most convenient place for vessels; which was read and referred to Messrs R. Stevens, Wright, J. B. Eccleston, Brown and Nicholson.

On motion by Mr. Barney, Leave given to bring in a bill, entitled, A supplement to an act, entitled, An act for the better regulation of the militia of the city of Baltimore. Ordered, That Messrs Barney, Marriott and Hayward, report the same.

On motion by Mr. Orrick, Leave given to bring in a bill, entitled, A supplement to an act, entitled, An act concerning crimes and punishments, and to regulate the salaries of the first keeper, clerks and agents, of the Maryland penitentiary. Ordered, That Messrs Orrick, Barney, Snowden, Maulsby and Key, report the same.

Mr. Cockey reports a bill, entitled, An act for the relief of negro Ann and her three children, of Frederick county. Mr. Posey reports a bill, entitled, An act to authorise the levy court of Charles county to build a bridge over Allens Fresh Run; which was read.

Mr. Snowden presents a petition from Thomas Mayfield, stating that he has obtained a patent for a threshing machine, and offering to give the state a right to the same within the limits of said state, on condition that the legislature will grant him a lottery to raise one thousand dollars; which was read and referred to Messrs. Snowden, Showers and Barney.

Mr. Orrick presents a petition from Thomas Gist, of Baltimore county, praying a law may pass to prevent him from being harrassed by applications from Thomas Owings to the county court for a road through his the said Gist's land; which was read and referred to Messrs Orrick, Marriott, Wright, Wilson and J. P. Kennedy.

Mr. B. S. Forrest presents a petition from Thomas Simpson, of Montgomery county, praying a confirmation of his title to real property purchased before he was naturalized; which was read and referred to Messrs B. S. Forrest, Harding and Gaither.

Mr. Barney reports a bill, entitled, A supplement to an act, entitled, An act to prevent the issuing of small bank notes. Mr. Lake reports a bill, entitled, An act supplementary to the act for amending and reducing into system the laws and regulations concerning last wills and testaments, the duties of executors, administrators and guardians, and the rights of orphans and other representatives of deceased persons. And Mr. T. N. Williams reports a bill, entitled, An act relating to public roads and public landings in Worcester county; which were read.

The bill for draining a branch on Chesler river, commonly called and known by the name of the Unicorn Branch, was read the second time, passed, and sent to the senate.

Mr. Whitely reports a bill, entitled, An act to repeal the act of assembly therein mentioned. And a bill, entitled, An act to authorise William Stevens, late collector of Caroline county to complete his collection; which were read.

Mr. B. Forrest reports a bill, entitled, An act to make valid a deed from Daniel Carroll to Thomas Simpson; which was twice read, passed, and sent to the senate.

Mr. Warfield reports a bill, entitled, An act for the relief and benefit of Willoughby Maybury of Frederick county; which was twice read, passed, and sent to the senate.

Mr. Duvall reports a bill, entitled, An act authorising and empowering the levy court of Anne-Arundel county to discontinue out pensioners, and for other purposes; which was read.

Mr. Lecompte reports a bill, entitled, An act to confirm an act passed at December session 1819, entitled, An act to alter the time of the meeting of the general assembly of this state, and for other purposes; which was read. On motion by Mr. Bowles, Ordered, That the same have a second reading on Wednesday next.

On motion by Mr. T. Kennedy, Leave given to bring in a bill, entitled, A supplement to the act, entitled, An act to incorporate a company to make a turnpike road from Boonsborough through Williamsport, to intersect the turnpike road now making from Cumberland to the west bank of Conococheague, passed December session 1817. And leave to bring in a bill, entitled, A supplement to the act, entitled, An act to incorporate a company to make a turnpike road from the west bank of the Conococheague creek, at Williamsport, to intersect the Cumberland turnpike road at or near the Stone Quarry Ridge, passed December session 1818. Ordered, That messrs. T. Kennedy, Bowles and Kershner, report the same.

Mr. T. Kennedy reports the said bills; which were twice read and passed.
