On motion by Mr. T. Kennedy, the following resolution was read, assented to, and sent to the senate. Resolved, That the governor and council be requested to publish, as early as possible, in as many newspapers on each shore as they may deem necessary, for the information of the people, the supplementary law relative to the stay of executions, passed at the present session, and that they be requested to transmit an authenticated copy of said law to the clerks of the different counties.

Mr. Nicholson delivers the following report: The committee to whom was referred the petition of William Jacobs, of Queen-Anne's county, praying for remuneration for the use of his granary in which public arms were deposited during the late war, by order of Colonel James Brown, beg leave to report—That they have had the same under consideration, and believing the claim to be just and reasonable, submit the following resolution:

The resolution in favour of Thomas Wright, and others, was read the second time, assented to, and sent to the senate.

Mr. Gaither presents a petition from Anthony Ricketts, of Montgomery county, praying the original will of Sarah Briscoe may be delivered to him, to use as testimony in the state of Virginia; which was read and referred to Messrs. Gaither, Wright and Key.

Mr. Bowles reports a bill, entitled, An act to change and alter the name of William Heyser Quantrell to that of Jesse Duncan Elliott Quantrell; which was read.

The bill for the benefit of Mary Young, Henry W. Fitzhugh, and Elizabeth Dickins, of the city of Baltimore, was read the second time, passed, and sent to the senate.

The bill to ratify the proceedings of the commissioners appointed by Dorchester county court to the division of the lands and tenements of Doctor Daniel Sullivan, late of the same county, deceased, and the bill for the benefit of John Barnes, clerk of Charles county, were read the second time, passed, and sent to the senate.
