Resolved in the affirmative, and the resolution sent to the senate.

The clerk of the senate delivers reports from the trustees of Frederick Town Academy, Frederick county Bank, Baltimore and Havre-de Grace turnpike road, the Susquehanna bridge Company, and the commissioners of the school fund of Talbot county; which were read. The resolution in favour of the heirs of John Neptune, endorsed "assented to." And the bill to prevent the erection of booths within two miles of any Methodist camp or quarterly meeting in the several counties therein mentioned, endorsed "will pass with the proposed amendments;" which amendments were read, assented to, and the bill ordered to be engrossed.

On motion by Mr. J. P. Kennedy, Leave given to bring in a bill, entitled, A further supplement to an act, entitled, An act for the relief of sundry insolvent debtors, passed at November session 1805. Ordered, That Messrs. J. P. Kennedy, Barney and Gabby, report the same.

On motion by Mr. Maulsby, Leave given to bring in a bill, entitled, An act relating to the removal of causes from Baltimore county and Baltimore city courts to Harford county court for trial. Ordered, That Messrs. Maulsby, Allen, Snowden, J. P. Kennedy and J. B. Eccleston report the same.

The bill to incorporate the Medical Society of Baltimore, and the bill for the benefit of Samuel Jones, were read the second time and passed.

On motion by Mr. R. Stevens, Leave given to bring in a bill, entitled, A supplement to an act to erect a bridge over the Narrows of Kent Island, in Queen Anne's county, passed December session 1819. Ordered, That Messrs. R. Stevens, R. Moffitt and Wright, report the same.

Mr. Marriott presents a petition from Edward Chambers of Anne-Arundel county; which was read and referred to the committee on pensions and revolutionary claims.

Mr. Maulsby presents the following report:

The committee to whom was referred so much of the executive communication of the 7th of December 1820, as relates to a contemplated amendment of the constitution of the United States, proposed by the legislature of Pennsylvania, having duly considered the subject, are decidedly of opinion that the interest of the union would be materially jeopardized should the proposed amendment be adopted. The committee therefore recommend the following resolutions, to wit:

Resolved, by the general assembly of Maryland, That it is inexpedient to concur in the amendment to the constitution of the United States, proposed to the constitution of the several states by the state of Pennsylvania, which is as follows to wit:

Congress shall make no law to erect or incorporate any banks, or other monied institution, except within the District of Columbia; and every bank, or other monied institution, which shall be established by the authority of congress, shall together with its branches and offices of discount and deposit, be confined to the District of Columbia.

Resolved, That the governor of this state be requested to forward copies of the foregoing resolution to the executives of the several states, with a request that the same may be laid before the legislatures thereof.
