

The clerk of the senate delivers the supplement to an act to provide for the opening and extension of Pratt street, endorsed 'will not pass.' The resolution in favour of Edward Wright, and the resolution in favour of Matthew Horsey and Robert Elzey, endorsed 'assented to.' And a report with sundry resolutions, relative to the appropriations of public land for the purposes of education. Ordered, That the same have a second reading on Tuesday next.

Mr. S. Stevens reports a bill for the relief of Maria W. B. Beckwith of Talbot county. Mr. J. Kennedy reports a bill, entitled, An act authorising Job Smith, of Baltimore county, to remove a coloured mulatto girl into the state of Maryland. Mr. Edelen reports a bill, entitled, An act to confirm the appointment of collector of the tax for Charles county, and for other purposes. And Mr. Maulsby reports a bill, entitled, An act for the relief of Margaret Cooper, of Harford county; which were read.

The supplement to the act, entitled, An act to authorise the trustees from Calvert county for Charles Hall School to secede from the management thereof, and for other purposes, was read the second time. On motion by Mr. Lecompte, That the words 'for the use and benefit of Calvert county,' in the clause, proposing to withdraw one fourth of the funds, to remain in the treasury for the use of Calvert county, be stricken out, for the purpose of inserting the words 'subject to the appropriation of the legislature?'

The question was divided and put on striking out? The yeas and nays being required, appeared as follow:

After some time spent in reading and debating the same, on motion by Mr. S. Stevens, the same was recommitted.

On the second reading of the bill respecting the turnpike road leading from Baltimore to Cumberland, on motion by Mr. Beckett, the question was put, That the same be referred to the next general assembly? The yeas and nays being required appeared as follow:

The committee to whom was referred the petition of Thomas Marriott, of Baltimore county, for an out pension, beg leave to report—That they have had the same under their consideration, and are of opinion, that inasmuch as the act of assembly passed at December session eighteen hundred and seven, chapter 87, appointing trustees of the poor-house of Baltimore county, vesting discretionary power in said trustees to grant so many out pensioners of said poor-house as they may consider reasonable and proper, the allowance for whose support shall not exceed in the whole the rate of forty-dollars each, therefore your committee deem it unnecessary for the legislature to pass any law on this subject, and commend that the petitioner have leave to withdraw his petition.
