

MONDAY, February 19, 1821.

The house met. Present the same members as on Saturday. The proceedings of Saturday were read. On motion by Mr. Orrick, Ordered, That when this house adjourns, it stands adjourned until the first Monday in October next.

On motion, by Mr. Orrick, the following resolution was read, assented to, and sent to the senate: Resolved, That the Treasurer of the western shore pay to each attending member of the legislature, twenty dollars, and to the president of the senate, and speaker of the house of delegates, twenty five dollars each, for five days attendance since the journal of accounts was closed, and twenty dollars to each of the clerks, except those who were called in on Friday last, who shall receive sixteen dollars each; and to the other officers now attending the two branches of the said legislature the sum of twenty dollars each; and that the committee of claims furnish the treasurer with a list of all the attending members and other officers; and that the said treasurer pay to John and Thomas Vence, or to their order, the sum of sixty dollars upon his receiving one set of Bacon's Abridgement, which had been ordered for the use of the legislature.

Resolved, That such of the members as attended on Saturday, shall receive the sum of eight dollars, and that those who attended on Friday last, shall receive four dollars, and that the committee of claims furnish the treasurer with a list of such members as were present on Thursday last, and also a list of the members, as attended on the days herein mentioned.

Resolved, That the treasurer of the western shore pay to Jehu Chandler, or his order, the sum of twenty one dollars, the amount of his account for printing, &c. not allowed on the journal of accounts.

The engrossed bills from No. 192 to 195 inclusive, and from 199 to 204 inclusive, were read, assented to, and with the paper bills sent to the senate.

The clerk of the senate returned the said bills, severally endorsed 'read and assented to'

The house resumed the consideration of the bill to repeal an act for the relief of the managers of the Medical College Lottery passed at the present session. On motion by Mr. Orrick, the question was asked, That the same be rejected? The yeas and nays being required appeared as follow:

On motion by Mr. S. Stevens, the following message was read, assented to, and sent to the senate:

BY THE HOUSE OF DELEGATES, Feb. 19, 1821.

Gentlemen of the Senate,

Having finished all the business before us we propose, with your concurrence, to close the session immediately. Messrs. S. Stevens and Plater are appointed to join the gentlemen to be named on your part on his excellency the governor, and request his attendance in the senate chamber to sign and seal the laws, agreeably to the constitution and form of government.

The clerk of the senate delivers the engrossed bills No. 205, 206, 210 and 211, severally endorsed 'read and assented to,' which were read, assented to, and returned to the senate. Also the resolution in favour of the printer to the state, and the resolution in favour of the members, clerks, &c. endorsed 'assented to' and the following message:

BY THE SENATE, February 19, 1821.

Gentlemen of the House of Delegates,

We are prepared to close the session immediately, and have appointed Messrs. Emerson and West, on your part of the senate, to join the gentlemen named by your house, to wait on the governor, and request his attendance in the senate chamber, for the purpose of signing the laws, according to the constitution and form of government.

Mr. Taney and Mr. Carmichael from the senate, inform the speaker that the governor is attending in the senate chamber to sign and seal the engrossed bills, and request his attendance, with that of the members, of the house for that purpose.

The speaker left the chair, and attended by the members of this house, went to the senate, and there delivered the engrossed bills to the governor, who signed the same and affixed the great seal thereto, in the presence of both houses.

The speaker, with the rest of the members, returned and resumed the chair.

The house adjourns until the first Monday of October next.
