On motion by Mr. Stevens, Leave given to bring in a bill entitled, An act to confirm an act passed the last session of the Legislature, to alter, change and repeal all such parts of the Constitution and form of government of this state, as relates to the division of Queen Ann's county into election districts. Ordered, That Messrs. Stevens, Nicholson and Meconekin report the same.

On motion Mr. Allen, Leave given to bring in a bill entitled, An act to abolish survivorship in Joint tenancy. Ordered, That Messrs. Allen, Stevens and Dorsey report the same.

On motion by Mr. Kennedy. Ordered, That a committee of three be named by the chair, to enquire into and report what laws will expire with the present session. Ordered, That Messrs. Kennedy, Bruce and Loockerman be the said committee.

#### THURSDAY, DECEMBER 6th, 1821.

The house met. Present the same members as on yesterday. The proceedings of yesterday were read.

The message relative to the appointment of a senator to represent this state in the senate of the United States, was sent to the senate.

Mr. Sprigg presents a petition from Samuel Hoblitzell, of Allegany county, praying a special act of insolvency; which was read and referred to Messrs. Sprigg, Greenwell and Wiatt.

Mr. Allen presents a petition from sundry inhabitants of Harford county, praying that the funds now given to the different schools, colleges and academies may be withdrawn, and appropriated to the education of poor children; which was read and referred to the committee appointed on a petition of a similar nature.

The speaker laid before the house a report from the Clerk of Dorchester county, relative to the attendance of judges; which was read and referred to the committee of grievances and courts of justice.

Mr. Griffith reports a bill entitled, an act to change the name of William Naus Murray Robertson, to that of William Naus Murray; which was read the first and second time by special order, passed and sent to the senate.
