That it appears to your committee the said treasurer hath paid away from the first day of December, 1820, to the first day of December, 1821, the sum of 154,076 dollars and 89 cents, for all which payments, have been produced to your committee, the necessary vouchers and receipts; and that there remains in the treasury the sum of 133 717 dollars and 83 cents exchanged six per cent. stock of the United States; 335,104 dollars and 74 cents funded three per cent stock of the United States; 4,137 dollars and 28 cents of the emissions of bills of credit made by an act of congress of the 18th of March, 1790, and the sum of 76,875 dollars and 74 cents cash, which last mentioned sum is appropriated in the manner following, viz:

FRIDAY, DECEMBER 7, 1821.

The house met. Present the same members as on yesterday. The proceedings of yesterday were read.

The speaker laid before the house a communication from the treasurer of the Eastern Shore, in compliance with an order of the house of delegates of the 23rd January, 1819; which was read and referred to the committee of claims.

Mr. Allen reports a bill entitled, An act to abolish survivorship in joint tenancy; which was read.

Mr. Garner presents a petition from Basil Nelson, of Charles county, praying for a divorce; which was read and referred to Messrs Garner, Jenifer and Rogerson.

Mr. Edelin presents a petition from sundry inhabitants of Port Tobacco, praying for a repeal of that part of the act of last session, appointing commissioners for said town; which was read and referred to Messrs Edelin, Jenifer and Garner.

Mr H Kemp reports a bill entitled, An act authorising Elizabeth Hoffman to remove her female negro slave from the state of Virginia into this state; which was read.
