

Mr. Barney reports a bill entitled, An act for the relief of Enoch Betts, of the city of Baltimore, and a bill for the relief of Peter Ulrick, of the city of Baltimore.

And Mr. A. Spence reports a bill entitled, An act to authorise John Aydelotte, of Worcester county, to bring into the state of Maryland his negro slave named Parker; which were read.

The bill to alter and change the place of holding the elections in the first election district in Harford county, was read the second time by special order, passed, and sent to the senate.

Mr. Dalrymple presents a petition from Elizabeth Dawkins, of Calvert county, praying for a pension for the revolutionary services of her husband; read and referred to the committee on pensions and revolutionary claims.

Mr. Kennedy presents a petition from Stanley Robinson; read and referred to the committee on pensions and revolutionary claims.

Mr. Weems presents a petition from James Smith, of Calvert county, praying for support; read and referred to Messrs Weems, Dalrymple and Smith.

Mr. Forwood presents a petition from the president and directors of the Susquehanna Bridge Company, praying for a lottery; read and referred to Messrs Forwood, Norris and Barney.

Mr. Sulivane presents a petition from Solomon Frazier, a revolutionary soldier; read and referred to Messrs Sulivane, Allen, Dorsey, Greenwell, Carroll, Hall and Marriott.

On motion by Mr. Barney, Leave given to bring in a bill entitled, An act to renew the charters of the banks in the city of Baltimore, provided they shall make and complete a good and sufficient turnpike road from Boonsborough to Hager's Town. Ordered, That Messrs Barney, Bowles and Weems report the same.

Mr. Brown reports a bill entitled, An act for the relief of the poor of Anne Arundel county being supplementary to the act entitled, An act for the relief of the poor of the several counties therein mentioned.

Mr. Kennedy reports a bill entitled, An act for the relief of Michael Lacey, of the city of Baltimore. Mr. Garner reports a bill entitled, An act for the support and maintenance of Mary Farrell, of Charles county; and Mr. Nabb reports a bill entitled, a supplement to the act entitled, An act to provide for the organization and regulation of the courts of common law in this state, and for the administration of justice therein; which were read.

On motion by Mr. Sprigg, Leave given to bring in a bill entitled, An act to change, alter and repeal all such parts of the constitution and form of government of this state as relate to the election of delegates from the city of Baltimore. Ordered, That Messrs Sprigg, Barney and Kennedy report the same.

On motion by Mr. Loockerman, that Leave be given to bring in a bill entitled, an act to alter and amend such parts of the constitution and form of government as relate to the election of delegates from each county, the question was put that said leave be granted.

Mr. Riggs reports a bill entitled, An act for the relief of Thomas Henry and his wife, of Montgomery county; which were read.

Mr. Nabb presents a petition from Robert Morris, praying permission to remove a slave from Delaware to Maryland; read and referred to Messrs Nabb, Martin and Forwood.

Mr. Duvall reports a bill entitled, An act to repeal an act entitled, an act for the relief of Edward Godman, of Montgomery county; which was read.

Mr. Loockerman presents a petition from James C. Wheeler, praying a special act of insolvency; read and referred to Messrs Loockerman, J. Forrest and C. Kemp.

The additional supplement to the Act to erect a new market house in Hager's Town, in Washington county, was read the second time and passed.
