

The bill to regulate the pay of the judges of the orphan's court of Somerset county, was read the second time, and so amended as to include Washington, Baltimore, Charles, Saint Mary's, Frederick, Dorchester and Talbot counties. And on motion by Mr. Bowler, the title was amended accordingly. The bill was then passed and sent to the senate.

The further additional supplement to an act entitled, An act for the erection of a new market house in Hager's Town, Washington county, and for other purposes, was read the second time, passed and sent to the senate.

On motion by Mr. Forwood, the following rule was read and assented to:

42d No person shall be admitted within the bar of this house, but ladies, present and former members of the legislature, the officers of the government, members of congress and of the state legislatures

The report in favor of Abraham Ross, of Dorchester county, was read the second time, the resolution therein contained assented to and sent to the senate.

The bill to authorise and empower the levy court of Anne Arundel county to assess and levy a sum of money for the purposes therein mentioned, was read the second time, passed and sent to the senate.

Mr Culler presents a petition from John Jamison and others, praying permission to remove certain negroes into this state; read and referred to Messrs Culler, Llewellyn and Pigman.

Mr Pigman presents the following report:

The committee to whom was referred the petition of Charles P. Graze, of Frederick county, beg leave to report, That they have had the same under consideration, and are of opinion that the prayer of the petitioner cannot be granted, and do recommend that the petitioner have leave to withdraw his petition.

The bill for the benefit of George and William Reid, of Caroline county, and the bill for the relief of Henry Truitt, of Worcester county, was read the second time, passed and sent to the senate.

Mr Orrick presents a petition from the trustees of the Chesapeake academy, in Cecil county, praying to be incorporated; read and referred to Messrs Archer, Williams and Mallitt.

Mr Norris presents a petition from sundry inhabitants of Harford county, praying for the ascertaining the divisional line between Cecil and Harford counties; which was read and referred to the committee on petitions of a similar nature.

The bill to lay out ground for a wharf and lumber yard on Stapleford's creek, in Dorchester county, was read the second time, passed and sent to the senate.

The bill to authorise the establishment of an additional ware house in the city of Baltimore for the inspection of tobacco, was read the second time, passed and sent to the senate.

The clerk of the senate delivers the bill to alter a certain road in Harford county, endorsed, "will pass." Ordered to lie engrossed. Also a bill entitled, An act to lay out and make public two roads therein mentioned in Cecil county, and a bill entitled, An act authorising commissioners to make alterations in the election districts of Montgomery county; which were read.

The bill for the benefit of Robert Guest, of Charles county, was read the second time, passed and sent to the senate.

On motion by Mr Dorsey, Leave given to bring in a bill entitled, An act declaring the right of the accused, to tender bills of exception to the opinion and directions of the courts of common law in trials for the crimes therein mentioned. Ordered, That Messrs Dorsey, Kennedy, Pigman, Julius Forrest and Edeien report the same.

The bill annulling the marriage of Thomas Knock and wife, was read the second time, and withdrawn for amendment.

The bill to make public two roads in Baltimore county, was read the second time, passed and sent to the senate.

Mr Culler reports a bill entitled, An act for the benefit of John Jamison, executor of Leonard Jamison; which was read the first and second time by special order, passed and sent to the senate.

Mr Pigman reports a bill entitled, An act annulling the marriage of George Haupt, of Frederick county. Also a bill entitled, An act for the benefit of Adam Myers, of Frederick county; which were read.

The bill for the benefit of Elijah Nelson, of Worcester county, was read the second time, passed and sent to the senate.

The bill to make valid a deed therein mentioned, was read the second time, passed and sent to the senate.

The house according to the order of the day, proceeded to the second reading of the further supplement to the act entitled, An act to regulate the inspection of tobacco, which was so amended as to confine it to Charles and Saint Mary's counties, and the city of Baltimore.

The house adjourns until to morrow morning 9 o'clock.
