Spence reports a bill entitled, An act to amend and reduce into one, the several acts of Assembly relating to the public roads of Worcester county; and Mr. King reports a bill entitled, A supplement to an act entitled, An act to confirm and make valid the acts and proceedings of the commissioners of the town of Princess Anne, in Somerset county, which were read.

Mr. Marriott presents a petition from William Stinchcomb, of Anne Arundel county, praying for support; read and referred to the committee on petitions of a similar nature.

The bill for the benefit of Adam Myers was read the second time, and on motion by Mr. Dennis the question was put, that the same be referred to the next General Assembly? Determined in the negative.

The question was then put, shall the said bill pass? Determined in the negative.

The clerk of the senate delivers the bill for the benefit of Lebanon Chappel in Talbot county and the bill to make public two roads in Baltimore county, endorsed "will pass." Ordered to be engrossed. And the following message.

Gentlemen of the House of Delegates,

As we do not approve of all the details of the bill passed by your body, entitled, An act relating to the University of Maryland, and have no authority to amend the same, we would suggest the propriety of a committee of conference on this subject, and for that purpose, nominate Messrs. Price, Johnson, Dickinson, McKim, Brownly, Miller and Claude of this body to meet such gentlemen as you may appoint to constitute such committee, with directions to report to their respective houses the result of their deliberations.
