In looking round for a resource against the evils above mentioned, your committee are happy to state, that they do not deem it necessary that any appropriations should be made at this time, from the treasury; they conceive that no hing more will be necessary, than to adopt some scheme which shall resone the credit of the institution, and enable it to obtain leans for the liquidation of its present debt, to be refunded at some distant day, either from the profits of the establishment, or from appropriations out of the treasury, for the payment of such portions of the debt at may then remain unpaid; the state at present, only pledging its faith for the assumption of that debt at some convenient, though definite period. With this design your committee have submitted the bill accompanying this report.
