

The clerk of the senate delivers the first reported bill relating to the University of Maryland, endorsed, "will not pass;" and the bill for the benefit of Robert Guest, of Charles county, endorsed, "will pass;" Ordered to be engrossed.

On motion by Mr Stevens, ORDERED, That the bill relating to constables' bonds, be recommitted.

The bill for the relief of Henry Korn, of Allegany county, was read the second time, passed and sent to the senate.

Mr Craig presents a memorial from Hezekiah Ford, of Cecil county, a revolutionary soldier; read and referred to Messrs Craig, Williams and Maffitt.

The bill for the benefit of Robert Usselson and Benjamin Arno, of Kent county; the bill to alter and change such parts of the constitution and form of government as relate to the division of Anne Arundel county into election districts, and to change the place of holding election in the second election district of said county; and the bill empowering the levy court of Cecil county at their discretion to levy a sum of money to build a bridge over Octarara creek in said county at or near Samuel Rowland's store; were read the second time, passed and sent to the senate.

On motion by Mr Bruce, the following resolution was read:

RESOLVED, That _____ be and they are hereby authorized to sell, dispose of and transfer, or to subscribe for and then transfer the unsubscribed shares of stock, or any part thereof, to which the state is entitled in the Bank of Baltimore, at such an advance as they may deem satisfactory; and when so sold, to place the proceeds in the said Bank of Baltimore to the credit of the treasurer of the western shore, and notify him thereof. And should the sale be made to the Bank of Baltimore, the president and directors are hereby authorized to dispose of the same to such person or persons as they may think proper, and cause transfers to be made accordingly.

Mr. Barney reports a bill entitled, An act for the relief of Ann Merryman of Baltimore; which was read.

The resolution in favor of Richard Graves, was read the second time, assented to, and sent to the senate.

The resolution in favor of John Smith, was read the second time and disvented from.

The clerk of the senate delivers the additional supplement to the act to regulate the inspection of lumber in the city and county of Baltimore, endorsed, "will pass;" Ordered to be engrossed.

Mr. Orrick reports a bill entitled, An act relating to the removal of causes for trial within the 4th district; which was read.

On motion by Mr. J. Forrest, the following resolution was read:

RESOLVED, by the General Assembly of Maryland, That the treasurer of the western shore be and he is hereby authorized and required to pay to Richard W. West, administrator de bonis non of Stephen West, the amount due on any certificate heretofore granted to Stephen West in his own right and as executor of William Hall, under the act entitled, An act for calling out of circulation the quota of this state of the bills of credit issued by congress, and passed at October session 1780, chapter 5, and which may not have been paid, in the same manner as if said certificates were now produced to him; provided the said Richard W. West shall give bond to be approved by the said treasurer, to refund the sum of money thus paid, if said certificates shall at any time be produced to the treasurer.

Mr. Barney reports a bill entitled, An act relating to the penitentiary of Maryland; and Mr. Neveer reports a bill entitled, An act to authorize the abutment of a bridge on the Maryland shore of the Potomac river at Harper's ferry and for other purposes; which were read.

The bill vesting certain property in the eastern part of the city of Baltimore, in trustees for the use and benefit of the society of Friends or people called Quakers in the said city, was read the second time and passed.

On motion by Mr A. Spence, leave given to bring in a bill entitled, An act authorising special juries of oyer and terminer, and for other purposes. Ordered that Messrs A. Spence, Marriott, and Loockerman, report the same.

On motion by Mr Dorsey, leave given to bring in a bill entitled, A further and additional supplement to an act entitled, An act concerning crimes and punishments. Ordered that Messrs Dorsey, Howles, and Barney report the same.

On motion by Mr Wyatt, leave given to bring in a bill entitled, A further additional supplement to the act entitled, An act for the relief of sundry insolvent debtors. Ordered that Messrs Wyatt, Forrest and Millard report the same.

The resolution in favor of Benjamin G. Jones, was read the second time and assented to.

The house adjourns until to morrow morning 9 o'clock.

TUESDAY, JANUARY 29, 1822.

The house met. Present, the same members as on yesterday. The proceedings of yesterday were read.

The bill vesting certain property in the eastern part of the city of Baltimore, in trustees for the use and benefit of the society of Friends or people called Quakers in the said city, and the resolution in favor of Benjamin G. Jones, were sent to the senate.

Mr. Maffitt reports a bill entitled, An act to make public an old road in Elk Neck, Cecil county; which was read.

The supplement to the act entitled, An act to incorporate companies to make several turnpike roads through Baltimore county and for other purposes, was read the second time, and will not pass.
