

the bill for opening roads in Harford county, severally endorsed, "will pass;" Ordered to be engrossed. The bill for the relief of Eljah Morris, Lydia Anthony and Margaret Wheret, of Harford county; and the bill to lay out and open a road in Baltimore county, endorsed, "will pass with the proposed amendments;" which amendments were read, assented to and the bills ordered to be engrossed; and the resolution in favor of Richard Graves, endorsed, "assented to."

On motion by Mr. Stevens, ORDERED, That the bill to alter the time of the meeting of the general assembly of this state and for other purposes, have a second reading on Tuesday next. The supplement to the act entitled, An act for the distribution of a certain fund for the purpose of establishing free schools in the several counties therein named, was read the second time, passed and sent to the senate.

Mr Bruce reports a bill entitled, An act apportioning the number of justices of the peace in each county; which was read.

Mr Bowles reports a bill entitled, A supplement to an act entitled, An act to incorporate a company to make a turnpike road from the public square in Hager's town to intersect the turnpike road leading from Gettysburgh through Nicholson's Gap, at the Pennsylvania line; which was read the first and second time by special order, passed and sent to the senate.

The bill to provide for the widening of East-street in the city of Baltimore; and the bill entitled, A supplement to an act to incorporate a society for the maintenance and education of poor female children by the name of the Benevolent Society of the City of Baltimore, were read the second time, passed and sent to the senate.

The amendments proposed to the bill for the relief of Mary Clap and others of the city of Baltimore were read the second time, "assented to," and the bill ordered to be engrossed.

Mr John S. Spence delivers the following report:

The committee to whom was referred the petition of sundry inhabitants of this state, relative to the circulating medium, beg leave to report, that they have had the same under their consideration, and concur in the conclusion, that it is expedient for the legislature to adopt any measure with the view of increasing the circulating medium of the state. They therefore recommend that the petitioners have leave to withdraw their petition.

On motion by Mr. John S. Spence, leave given to bring in a bill entitled, An act for the relief of the poor of Worcester county being supplementary to the act entitled, An act for the relief of the poor in the several counties of this state, ORDERED, That Messrs J. S. Spence, Purnell and Riley report the same.

On motion by Mr Barney, the following order was read:

ORDERED, That the committee of claims be authorised to pay all reasonable and necessary expenses (exclusive of board) incurred by the committee appointed by a joint resolution of both branches of the legislature to repair to and inspect the Susquehannah wing dam.

The bill relating to public notices in certain cases therein mentioned, was read the second time and sent to the senate.

On the second reading of the further supplement to an act entitled, An act for licencing and regulating ordinary keepers; on motion by Mr Bruce the same was re-committed.

The bill to authorise the establishment of an additional ware-house in the city of Baltimore, for the inspection of tobacco, was read the second time and passed.

The house adjourned until to-morrow morning 9 o'clock.

THURSDAY, JANUARY 31, 1822.

The house met. Present the same members as on yesterday. The proceedings of yesterday were read.

The bill to establish an additional ware-house in the city of Baltimore for the inspection of tobacco was sent to the senate.

Mr Barney presents a petition from John and Isaac Angel of the city of Baltimore, praying that the same be referred to John Stower and John Deer, may be declared not to be an undue preference; and referred to Messrs Barney, Pigman and Kennedy.

The bill to make valid a deed therein mentioned, and the bill appointing commissioners for the regulation and improvement of the village of Hillsborough in Caroline county, were read the second time, passed and sent to the senate.

The clerk of the senate delivers the bill to amend and reduce into one the several acts of assembly relating to the public roads in Worcester county, and the further supplement to an act entitled, An act to provide for the opening and extension of Pratt street in the city of Baltimore, endorsed, "will pass;" Ordered to be engrossed; and a bill entitled, An act relating to justices of the peace in the city of Baltimore, endorsed, "will pass;" which was read.

The resolution in favor of Solomon Frazier, was read the second time, assented to, and sent to the senate.

The supplement to the act entitled, An act to establish a patrol in St. Mary's, Anne Arundel, Prince George's and Charles counties, passed December session, 1820, chapter 200, was read the second time, passed and sent to the senate.

On motion by Mr Pigman, ORDERED, That the bill relative to the inspection of flour, have a second reading on to-morrow.

The bill to continue in force the acts of assembly which would expire with the present session, was read the second time, passed and sent to the senate.
