Messrs Speaker, Millard, Cannell, Kemp, Orrick, Showers, Loockerman, Nabb, Martin, Waters, Stevens, Moffett, H. Kemp, Pigman, Allen, Forwood, Norris, Wansford, Whitely, Hardcastle, Sautsbury, Bowles, Kershner, Hoffman, Greenwell, Wyatt.—26.

Resolved in the affirmative.

Mr. John S. Spence reports a bill entitled, An act for the relief of the poor of Worcester county, being supplementary to the act entitled, An act for the relief of the poor of the several counties of this state.

Mr. Kennedy reports a bill entitled, An act to incorporate the president and managers of the hot-tower company of Baltimore; and Mr. Barney reports a bill entitled, A supplement to an act entitled, A further supplement to an act entitled, An act to provide for the opening and extension of Pratt-street in the city of Baltimore; which were read.

The amendments to the supplement to the act incorporating into one the several acts relating to constables' fees, were read the second time, and all assented to except the third, which was dissented from.

The clerk of the senate delivers the bill for the benefit of Basil L. Stocker and others, and the bill for the relief of Roswell Noble of the city of Baltimore, endorsed, "will pass with the proposed amendments;" which amendments were read; and the further supplement to an act entitled, An act to making certain roads in Baltimore and Harford counties, endorsed, "will pass;" Ordered to be engrossed.

The house adjourns until to-morrow morning 9 o'clock.

FRIDAY, FEBRUARY 1, 1822.

The house met. Present the same members as on yesterday. The proceedings of yesterday were read.

The speaker laid before the house a report from the committee appointed to examine and report the state of the barracks at Frederick town; which was read.

The supplement to the act entitled, An act for founding a college on the western shore of this state, and constituting the same, together with the Washington college on the eastern shore, into one university, by the name of the University of Maryland, was read the second time, passed and sent to the senate.

On motion by Mr. Forwood the following message was read, assented to and sent to the senate.

BY THE HOUSE OF DELEGATES, February 1, 1822.

Gentlemen of the Senate,

We have rejected the following words in the third amendment proposed by you to the bill entitled, A supplement to the act incorporating into one the several acts relating to constables' fees, to wit, "and that each constable shall receive for serving execution on body and return thereof, the sum of thirty three and a third cents;" all the other amendments and the foregoing part of the third amendment has been assented to by us.

We herewith return the bill to your honorable body and hope upon re-consideration that you will pass the same without that part which has been rejected by us.

Mr. Waters reports a bill entitled, A further supplement to an act entitled, An act for the recovery of small debts out of court and for other purposes; which was read.

On motion by Mr. Nabb, leave given to bring in a bill entitled, An act respecting the fees of certain officers in this state, and for other purposes. Ordered that Messrs Nabb, Bruce, Forwood, Pigman and Stevens report the same.

The bill for the benefit of William Harness, of Allegany county; the bill for the benefit of William Osburn of Allegany county, and the bill for the benefit of Thomas I. Perry, late of Allegany county, were read the second time, passed and sent to the senate.

Mr. Craig presents a petition from John C. Hull, of Cecil county, praying to be released from a bond given by him to the state, for confiscated property, upon his relinquishing his equitable interest in and to the same; which was read and referred to Messrs Craig, Maffitt and Williams.

The clerk of the senate delivers the bill for the benefit of Robert Uselton and Benjamin Arno, of Kent county; and the bill empowering the levy court of Cecil county, at their discretion, to levy a sum of money to build a bridge over Octarara creek in said county at or near Samuel Rowland's store, endorsed, "will pass;" Ordered to be engrossed.

Mr. Bruce reports a bill entitled, A further supplement to an act for licensing and regulating ordinary keepers; which was read.

On motion by Mr. Edelen, leave given to bring in a bill entitled, A further supplement to the act entitled, An act authorising a lottery to raise a sum of money to build a church in Charles county; passed at November session, 1817. Ordered, That Messrs Edelen, Garner and Rogerson report the same.

The speaker laid before the house a report from the clerk of Montgomery county, relative to the attendance of judges; which was read.

The amendments proposed to the bill for the relief of Roswell Noble, of the city of Baltimore, were read the second time, assented to and the bill ordered to be engrossed.

On motion by Mr. Pigman, ORDERED, That the bill relative to the inspectors of flour, have a second reading on Monday next.

Mr. Pigman reports a bill entitled, An act for the benefit of Barbara Hoffman, George Hoffman, Henry Crum and Barbara Crum his wife, John Hoffman and Peter Hoffman of Frederick county; which was read.
