Mr Craig presents a petition from George Beaston, of Cecil county, praying he may be permitted to remove a negro boy into this state; read and referred to Messrs Craig, Williams and Maffitt.

Mr. Julius Forrest presents a petition from Thomas C. Scott, of Prince George's county, praying that a lease from Charles Cartoll, of Carrollton, to him may be rescinded; read and referred to Messrs J. Forrest, Chew and Culver.

Mr. Barney presents a petition from Michael M'Blair and others, praying for the incorporation of a company to carry on a cotton factory; read and referred to Messrs Barney, Hughes and Kennedy.

Mr John S. Spence presents a petition from sundry inhabitants of Somerset and Worcester counties, counter to the building a bridge over Wicomico river, at Whitehaven; read and referred to the committee appointed on the petition to which it is counter.

The clerk of the senate delivers the bill to appoint commissioners for the purpose of altering the divisional line between the first and fourth election districts in Allegany county; the supplement to the act entitled, An act for founding a college on the western shore of this state, and constituting the same, together with Washington College on the Eastern shore into one University, by the name of the University of Maryland; the bill to authorise the establishment of an additional warehouse in the city of Baltimore for the inspection of tobacco, and the bill to continue in force the acts of the assembly which would expire with the present session; severally endorsed, "will pass." Ordered to be engrossed. The further supplement to an act entitled, An act for the distribution of a certain fund for the purpose of establishing free schools in the several counties therein named, and for other purposes, endorsed, "will pass with the proposed amendments," which amendments were read, assented to, and the bill ordered to be engrossed. A bill entitled, An act to alter such parts of the constitution and form of government as relate to voters and qualification of voters, so far as they concern the city of Baltimore, endorsed, "will pass;" which was read. The resolution in favor of Benjamin G. Jones, endorsed, "assented to." The bill for the benefit of Marcellus Keene of the
