Ordered, That Messrs John S. Spence, Riley and King report the same. Mr John S. Spence reports said bill; which was read.

The bill to alter and change the place of holding the election in the third election district of Dechester county, was read the second time and passed.

The bill to authorise the orphans' court of Montgomery county to appoint a trustee to convey the lands of the heirs of John A.
