They are also of ounion that the word "&c," in the second line of the first section should be stricken out, and that before the world "liquors," in the second line and section, there ought to be meeted the words " face rum, brandy, wh skey, and other distilled spiritous," so as to tax only the wholesale dealer for vending the same suit of liquors as the retail dealer is taxed for. This perhaps would not be tile case if the amendment suggested was not made.
