And it is further Resolved, That all the revenue to result from the tolls of canals, on the stock to be held by this state, shall be assigned and inviolably pledged for the support and maintenance of public instruction of all the youth throughout this state.

Mr. Norris presents petitions from Thomas Cheneworth, and James Curry. which were read

and referred to the committee on pensions and revolutionary claims.

Mr. Kilgour reports a bill, entitled, An act regulating and establishing the amount of money the examiner general shall annually receive for his services.

Mr. Teackle reports a bill, entitled, An act to impose and collect a tax upon such parts of the

estates of deceased persons as avoid assessment.

Mr. Kilgour reports a bill, entitled, An act appointing commisssioners to extend Washington street, in Rockville, and for other purposes.

Mr. George Leigh reports a bill, entitled, An act for the relief of Stephen Bryan, of Saint-

Mr. Ireland reports a bill, entitled, An act for the support of Martha Conner, the idiot daughter of James Conner, of Kent county.

Mr. Stansbury reports a bill, entitled, A further & additional supplement to an act concerning

crimes and punishments.

And Mr. Howard reports a bill, entitled, An act directing the levy court of Anne-Arundel county to appoint collectors of the county tax in and for the county aforesaid, and the city of Annapolis; which was read.

Mr. Purviance presents a petition from Nathaniel Locke, Alexander Marr, and Henry Berman, praying for the payment of damages on the holders of property on Forrest street; read and

referred to Messrs. Purviance, Carroll and John P. Kennedy.

The additional supplement to the act to regulate the inspection of tobacco; and the bill to appoint a collector of the county tax for each election district in Anne-Arundel county, were recommitted.

The clerk of the senate delivers a bill, entitled, An act relating to Chester Parish in Kent county; a bill, entitled, An act for the benefit of Thomas Atkins, of Cecil county; and a bill, entitled, An act to incorporate the Maryland Manufacturing Company; endorsed will pass which was read.

The bill to release the right of the state to a part of a tract of land therein mentioned, and the supplement to an act to incorporate a company to make a wharf at the town of Cambridge, in Dorchester county, endorsed "will pass" Ordered to be engrossed.

Also a bill relinquishing the right of the state of Maryland to certain lands therein referred to unto the heirs of Richard Stringer, deceased; a supplement to the act, entitled, An act to repeal parts of the acts of assembly therein mentioned; and the bill for the relief of Thomas J. Perry, late of Allegany county, endorsed "will pass with the proposed amendment;" which amendments were read, assented to and the bills ordered to be appropried. mendments were read, assented to, and the bills ordered to be engrossed.

The supplement to an act, entitled, An act for the relief of the poor of the several counties in this state; and the bill for the relief of the poor of Prince-George's county, being supplementary to the act, entitled, An act for the relief of the poor of the several counties in the state, were

read the second time, passed, and sent to the senate.
