On motion by Mr. Linthicum, leave given to bring in a bill, entitled, an act for the re-valuation of real and personal property in the several counties therein mentioned; ordered that Messrs. Linthicum, Howard, Hughes, M'Henry and Brice, report the same.

On motion by Mr. W. Duvall, leave given to bring in a bill, entitled, an act for the support of Henry Gettings, of Montgomery county; ordered that Messrs. W. Duvall, Peter and Williams report the same.

On motion by Mr. Douglass, leave given to bring in a bill, entitled, an act to repeal all such parts of the constitution and form of government, as relates to the election of four delegates from each county; ordered that Messrs. Douglass, Elijah Barwick, Pitt, Gerry and Millard report the same.

On motion by Mr. Fisher, leave given to bring in a bill, entitled an act to enable the levy courts of the different counties in the state, to recover from delinquent supervisors and others, any ballance due the county by warrant, where the amount is less than fifty dollars; ordered that Messrs. Fisher, Cromwell, Kemp, Peter and Meconiken report the same.
