

VOTES AND PROCEEDINGS

Coxes town, Baltimore county. Ordered, that Messrs J. T. H. Worthington, Johnson and Ely report the same.

Mr. Fisher reports a bill entitled, an act to authorise the levy court of Frederick county to recover from delinquent supervisors and others, any balance due said county, as other small debts are out of court; which was read.

On motion by Mr. Nicholson, leave given to bring in a bill entitled, an additional supplement to an act entitled, an act authorising a lottery for raising a sum of money for the purposes therein mentioned, passed at November session, eighteen hundred and nine. Ordered, that Messrs. Nicholson, Meconiken and Moffett, report the same.

WEDNESDAY, December 10, 1823.

The House met. Present the same members as on yesterday. The Proceedings of yesterday were read.

Mr. Nicholson reports a bill entitled, a further additional supplement to an act entitled, an act authorising a lottery for raising a sum of money for the purposes therein mentioned, passed at November session eighteen hundred and nine; which was read.

The bill for the benefit of Benjamin McCreary and John Watkins, of Harford county, and the bill to authorise the levy court of Caroline county to levy on the assessable property of said county the sums of money therein mentioned, were read the second time, passed and sent to the senate.

Mr. Kemp reports a bill entitled, an act to authorise the Congregation of the German Reformed Church in Middletown, in Frederick county, to raise a sum of money by lottery to defray the expese in part for building their church in said town; and Mr. W. G. D. Worthington reports a bill entitled, an act to incorporate the Fell's Point Beneficial Society of Baltimore; which were read.

On motion by Mr. Kilgour, leave given to bring in a bill entitled, An act organising and establishing district equity courts, and for other purposes therein mentioned. Ordered, that Messrs Kilgour, W. G. D. Worthington, Merrick, Loockerman, M'Henry, Fenwick and M' Mahon, report the same.

Mr. J. T. H. Worthington reports a bill entitled, an additional supplement to an act entitled an act authorising a lottery to raise a sum of money to purchase a lot of ground in Coxes town, in Baltimore county and to erect a building thereon, to be used as a school house and meeting house; which was read.

The bill to authorise Isaac Rawls and C. Wederstrandt to remove certain negroes into this state, and the bill to authorise Isaac Rawls and C. Wederstrandt to remove into this state certain negro slaves, were read the second time, passed and sent to the senate.

On motion by Mr. Peter, Ordered, that a committee be appointed to bring in a bill to be entitled, an act organising and settling the division of the different electoral districts for the president and vice president of the United States. The Speaker appointed Messrs Peter, Loockerman, Pitt, W. Stewart, Kemp, Eder and J. T. H. Worthington, Sewell and Meconiken to be the said committee.

On motion by Mr. Semmes, the following message was read the second time, assented to, and sent to the senate:
