grossed.

Ordered that the committee appointed to bring in a bill to reform the constitution report the same.

On motion by Mr. E. B. Davall, leave given to bring in a bill entitled, an act to alter and amend such parts of the constitution as relate to the election of the senate, and council to the governor. Ordered, that Messes E. B. Duvall, Merrick, Fenwick, Pitt, Loockerman, Linthe-cum and Peter, report the same.

The additional supplement to the bill to authorise Henry Vernon Somerville to remove certain negroes into the state of Muryland, and the pill to confirm the proceedings of William F. Gleaves as a justice of the peace, were read the second time, passed, and sent to the senate.
On motion by Mr. Millard, Ordered, that the Speaker direct all public bills which he may

think proper to be printed during the present session.

On motion by Mr. J. T. H. Worthington, Ordere I, that all bills which have been once read and are entitled to a second reading by the rules of this house, shall be arranged every morning agreeably to seniority, by the clerk, and placed on the speaker's desk, and taken up by the speaker second reading by the s ker in their turn, and read a second time, although no motion for a second reading has been
