

On motion by Mr. Millard the following order was read; ordered, that the house of delegates will proceed on the day of to the election of a director on the part of this state in the bank of Baltimore. is put in nomination to fill said appointment.

Mr. Bowles reports a bill entitled, an act further to extend the term fixed for the completion of the Turnpike road leading from Boonsborough to Swearingen's ferry in Washington county; which was read.

On motion by Mr. Crumwell, leave given to bring in a bill to alter the times of holding the county courts in Frederick county; ordered, that Messrs. Crumwell, Kemp and Fisher, report the same.

On motion by Mr. Kilgour, ordered, that a committee be appointed to draught a law to be entitled, a supplement to an act entitled, a supplement to the act entitled, an act relating to negroes and slaves; ordered, that Messrs. Kilgour, Wootton, J. T. H. Worthington, Meconiken and Henderson, report the same.

On motion by Mr. Edelen, leave given to bring in a bill entitled, an act to make valid the acts and proceedings of Walter M. Millar as a justice of the peace for Charles county; ordered, that Messrs. Edelen, Rogerson and Garner, report the same.

On motion by Mr. Semmes, leave given to bring in a bill entitled, an act, supplementary to an act for the relief of the poor of Prince George's county, passed December session, 1822, chapter 121; ordered, that Messrs. Semmes, Wootton and E. B. Duvall, report the same. Mr. Semmes reports said bill, which was twice read, passed and sent to the senate.

The clerk of the senate delivers the resolution relative to Humiliation and Prayer, endorsed, assented to.

The bill to settle and ascertain the salary of the members of the Council for the ensuing year; and the further supplement to the act entitled, an act for the distribution of a certain fund for the purpose of establishing free schools in the several counties therein mentioned; endorsed, will pass; ordered to be engrossed; also, the bill to authorise the Levy court of Caroline county to levy on the assessable property of said county the sums of money therein mentioned; endorsed, will pass with the proposed amendments, which amendments were read, assented to and the bill ordered to be engrossed.

On motion by Mr. W. G. D. Worthington the committee to reform the constitution was discharged from the consideration of the bill to confirm an act entitled, an act to extend to all the citizens of Maryland the same civil rights and privileges that are engaged under the constitution of the United States; ordered, that Messrs. W. G. D. Worthington, Semmes and Johnson, report the said bill; ordered, that the same have a second reading on the second Saturday in January.

Mr. Steel reports a bill entitled, an act for the benefit of the Stockholders of the Susquehanna Bridge; which was read.

On motion by Mr. J. T. H. Worthington, leave given to bring in a bill entitled, a further supplement to an act relating to the removal of causes for trial within the sixth judicial district; ordered, that Messrs. J. T. H. Worthington, W. Stewart and Johnson report the same.

On motion by Mr. Chesley the following resolution was read: Resolved, that the Attorney General and his deputies be directed to institute proceedings against the several county clerks in this state, to recover the penalty incurred by their neglect to comply with the twentieth section of the act of 1805, chapter 97, entitled, an act to reduce into one the several acts of Assembly therein mentioned.
