The house resumed the consideration of the bill to provide for the making the Baltimore Canal.

On motion by Mr. Merrick, that the following words be stricken out of the 7th section, to wit:

“And in case the city of Baltimore should at any time fail or neglect to pay either the principal or the interest of the money so borrowed, when the same is legally demandable, then and in that case the general assembly of the state of Maryland shall, for the purpose of paying and discharging the same, cause taxes to be levied and collected from the property within the city of Baltimore in such manner as they may think proper, in consideration whereof and for the purpose of giving greater solidity and strength to the credit of the city of Baltimore, so as to enable its corporation to affect the loan of the said sum of money at the lowest rate of interest, and upon the best possible terms the state of Maryland, doth hereby guarantee, that the city of Baltimore, shall in all things punctually and faithfully comply with its engagements for the payment of the principal and interest of the sum of money hereby authorised to be borrowed.”

Mr. Wootton moved to amend the same by adding the following to the words proposed to be stricken out: “Provided, that if the Mayor and City Council of Baltimore, shall fail to make, or discharge any of the several payments of principal and interest as provided in this bill, then the canal and all its appurtenances of every kind whatsoever which by this act is vested in the city of Baltimore, shall be the property of the state of Maryland:” and the question put that the house assent to the same. The yeas and nays being required appeared as follow:

“And all laws or acts of assembly of this state now in force, by virtue of which the corporation of the city of Baltimore is authorised and empowered to impose, levy and collect any license fees, taxes, duties or revenue of whatever nature or kind the same may be, for the uses and purposes of the city, shall continue and remain inviolate and unrepealed, until the whole sum of money which is authorised by this act to be borrowed on the credit of the said city, shall have been fully passed and satisfied.” Mr. Turbutt proposed the following to be added: “Provided, that it does not exceed twenty five years from the passage of this act.” Resolved in the affirmative.
