On motion by Mr. Wootton, the question was put, that the tenth, eleventh and twelfth sections which provides that the corporation of Baltimore shall have the exclusive right of building or procuring a tobacco inspection warehouse, when all other houses for that purpose shall cease. Resolved in the affirmative.

On motion by Mr. W. Stewart, the question was put, that the following be inserted in lieu of the clause stricken out.

And be it enacted, that in order to provide a fund for the payment of the interest and the final redemption of the principal sum or sums that shall or may be borrowed in virtue hereof, there shall be, and hereby is appropriated the nett annual proceeds arising from State Lotteries after deducting all expenses, and the sum of five thousand dollars, which is to be reserved and annually paid into the Treasury.

And whereas, the completion of the Washington Monument is an object in which the state feel a deep interest, and have heretofore granted authority to raise the requisite sum by a lottery or lotteries, which have, however, failed to answer the purpose, and the managers relying upon the productiveness of the said lotteries have incurred a considerable debt—Wherefore,

Be it enacted, that in addition to the five thousand dollars herein before reserved to the state, there shall be also reserved and retained out of the proceeds of the State Lotteries, the sum of seven thousand five hundred dollars annually, to be applied in the first instance towards the payment of the debts heretofore contracted by the managers of the Washington Monument lottery, and then to the finishing and completing of said Monument: Provided, however, that in consideration of the grant hereby made, all acts and parts of acts authorising lotteries for the benefit of the Washington Monument be, and the same are hereby repealed.

Mr. Jones presents a petition from sundry persons of Somerset county, praying for a public landing place in said county, referred to Messrs. Jones, Dennis and Dashiell.

Mr. W. G. D. Worthington, reports a bill, entitled an act for the relief of Dr. Joseph Alexander, of the city of Baltimore.
