In correction of this apparent error, we beg leave to inform you, that Samuel Stevens junior, is the person put in nomination by this house.

And the question put, That the house assent to the same? Determined in the negative. The house having qualified according to the constitution and form of government, proceeded to the choice of a governor; the ballots being deposited in the ballot box, the gentlemen named to strike retired to the conference room, and after sometime returned and reported, that Samuel Stevens was elected Whereupon Resolved, That Samuel Stevens be, and he is hereby declared to be, governor of Maryland
