The agent has further stated, that the present is one of those cases mentioned in his report of the 15th of January 1825, in which it became his hard duty, although it appeared almost like robbing, to take from the poor widow and orphan monies for which the husband and father had become security, and which but for the want of a proper system of revenue And the agent has also stated to your might long before have been received from the principal debtor committee that he is willing to relinquish the commission, to which he is by law entitled, on any amount the texislature may release to the petitioners. They therefore recommend the adoption of the following resolution:

Resolved, That all further proceedings on the part of the state against the securities of Thomas Pollard, late sheriff of Allegany county, he and the same are hereby directed to be suspended, and the amoun of the state's claim against said securities is hereby declared to be released and discharged, I'rovoted, they shall pay all the costs which the state may have incurred in the prosecution of the claims against I homas Poliard, or against any of his securities.
