

SIX O'CLOCK P. M. The house met.

Mr. Nicholson presents a petition from Doctor Robert Wright, of Queen-Anne's county, praying that the levy court of said county may be authorised to examine the account therein mentioned, and levy a sum for the payment of the same; referred to Messrs. Nicholson, Harris and Montgomery.

Mr. Nicholson obtained leave to bring in a bill, entitled, A supplement to the act incorporating the Town of Centre-Ville, Queen-Anne's county Ordered, That Messrs. Nicholson, Wright and Eccleston, report the same.

The report in favour of Daniel Schnebly, was read the second time, concurred with, and the resolution therein contained assented to, and sent to the senate.

Mr. King presents a petition from Pharaby Nicholson, for support; referred to the committee on similar petitions.

Mr. Turner obtained leave to bring in a bill, entitled, A supplement to an act for the recovery of small debts out of court, and to repeal the acts of assembly therein mentioned, passed at November session 1809. Ordered, That Messrs. Turner, Wootton, Hope, Tyson and White, report the same.

Mr. Wright presents a petition from William Gilbert, of Queen-Anne's county, praying he may have the privilege to erect gates on the public road; referred to the committee on the same subject.

Mr. Rogerson presents a petition from Henry Lyon Davis, praying a deed from Stephen Varlow to him may be recorded; referred to Messrs. Rogerson, Speed and Garner.

Mr. Willson reports a bill, entitled, An act to authorise the trustees of the poor for Montgomery county to purchase a piece of land adjoining the poor's house in said county; which was twice read by special order, passed, and sent to the senate.

Mr. Kilgour moved that the bill to authorise the levy court of Saint Mary's county to levy a sum of money on said county for purposes therein mentioned, be postponed until Thursday next? Determined in the negative.

Mr. Kilgour moved to refer the same to the next general assembly? Determined in the negative.

The question was then put, Shall the said bill pass? Resolved in the affirmative, and the bill sent to the senate.

The bill for the relief of Charles Carroll, of Carrollton, was read, the second time, and will not pass.

On the second reading of the bill for the benefit of the Salisbury Academy, Mr. Dennis moved to add to the title the words "in Worcester county?" Resolved in the affirmative.

The question was then put, Shall the said bill pass? The yeas and nays being required appeared as follow:

The bill for the relief of the heirs at law of Lawrence O'Neal, was read the second time, passed, and sent to the senate.

Mr. Nicholson reports a bill, entitled, An act for the relief of Dr. Robert Wright, of Queen-Anne's county.

Mr. Ireland reports a bill, entitled, An act supplementary to an act passed at Nov. session 1797, entitled, An act to establish and regulate a market at Bridge-town in Kent county, and for other purposes therein mentioned.

Mr. Kilgour presents a petition from Jeremiah Long, praying for support; referred to Messrs. Kilgour, Gough and Hawkins.

The bill to make sale of the poor's house and public lands thereto belonging in Talbot county, was read the second time, passed, and sent to the senate.

The house adjourns until to-morrow morning 9 o'clock.

TUESDAY, February 15, 1825.

The house met. Present the same members as on yesterday. The proceedings of yesterday were read. The bill relative to pilots, and the supplement to the militia law relative to the city of Baltimore, were sent to the senate.

Mr. Tyson presents a memorial from many citizens of Baltimore, praying for a law authorising the establishment of a public system of education in said city, referred to the committee on the same subject.

Mr. Speed presents a petition from the Agricultural Society of Maryland; referred to Messrs. Speed, Maxcy, Gantt, Norris and Dalrymple.

Mr. Tyson obtained leave to bring in a bill, entitled, An act to provide for the printing and publication of the laws of this state. Ordered, That Messrs. Tyson, Howard and Barnes, report the same. Mr. Tyson reports said bill.

Mr. Beall presents a petition from Francis Preston, of Montgomery county, praying for support; referred to Messrs. Beall, Willson and Lee.

Mr. Carroll presents a petition from Ann Lusby, praying for support; referred to the committee on similar subjects.

Mr. Maxcy obtained leave to bring in a bill, entitled, A further supplement to the act, entitled, A supplement to the act laying duties on licenses to retailers of dry goods, and for other purposes. Ordered, That Messrs. Maxcy, Carroll and Worthington, report the same.

Mr. Tyson presents a petition from sundry citizens of Baltimore city, praying the passage of a law, authorising the building a bridge over Sweetser's ferry on the Patapsco, referred to the committee on the same subject.
