

On motion by Mr. Thomas, Ordered, That the supplement to an act to lay out and make public two roads therein mentioned in Cecil county, have a second reading on the 15th February next.

Mr. M'Culloh reports a bill, entitled, An act to appoint trustees for the sale of the property therein mentioned, being the real estate of the late Samuel Stevenson, deceased; which was twice read by special order, passed, and sent to the senate.

Mr. Sewell reports a bill, entitled, An act to extend the benefit of an act passed February 11th, 1822, ch. 152, relating to public roads in the several counties therein mentioned, to Nathaniel Hoskin, of Harford county.

Mr. Ennalls reports a bill, entitled, An act to authorise the recovery of certain costs in suits instituted on administration and guardian bonds.

Mr. Worthington reports a bill, entitled, A supplement to the act, entitled, An act regulating the powers of the county courts in criminal proceedings.

Mr. Speed reports a bill, entitled, An act to ascertain and settle the law relative to writs of forcible entry and detainer.

Mr. Howard reports a bill, entitled, An act to authorise the establishment of a new Medical College in the city of Baltimore.

On motion by Mr. Barnes, Ordered, That the bill to enable purchasers to obtain possession of lands and premises sold by sheriffs, coroners and elisors, at public auction, have a second reading on the 25th inst.

Mr. Maxcy presents a petition from Palmer Canfield, praying to have a sum of money paid into the treasury refunded; referred to the committee of ways and means.

The bill to incorporate a school by the name of the Cincinnati School, in Harford county; the supplement to the act, entitled, An act to incorporate the Mutual Insurance Company of Baltimore; the bill for the relief of Barbara Wagers, and others; and the supplement to the bill to incorporate the town of Emmitsburg in Frederick county, were severally read the second time, passed, and sent to the senate.

The bill to appropriate a part of the school fund belonging to Frederick county to the purposes therein mentioned, was read the second time, passed, and sent to the senate.

The amendments to the bill to authorise John M'Tavish, to act as executor to Charles Carroll, of Carrollton, were read the second time, assented to, and the bill ordered to be engrossed.

The amendments to the bill to confirm the act to abolish so much of the constitution as relates to the oaths taken before the election of governor and council, were read the second time, assented to, and the bill ordered to be engrossed.
