

the state's capital as consists of three per cent. stock of the United States, provided that a capital of not less than two hundred and sixty eight thousand and eighty three dollars and fifty-five cents, of five per cents of the said stocks, may be obtained therefor; which said capital of two hundred and sixty-eight thousand and eighty-three dollars and fifty-five cents, of five per cent. stock of the United States, when obtained, shall be invested in the name of the said treasurer, as trustee, for the use of the state, in the manner and form that the three per cents are now invested.

Mr. Speed presents a petition from Mary Morgan, of the city of Annapolis, for support; referred to the committee on similar petitions.

Mr. Spencer presents a petition from the vestry of Saint Michael's Parish, praying for the confirmation of a deed therein mentioned; referred to Messrs. Spencer, Millis and Banning.

Mr. Cockey reports a bill, entitled, An act to provide for the payment of jurors in Frederick county.

Mr. Douglas reports a bill, entitled, An act for changing part of the divisional road between Dorchester and Caroline counties.

The house resolved itself into a committee of the whole on the bill relative to writs of forcible entry and detainer. Mr. Potter in the chair.
