The clerk of the senate delivers the resolution relative to the treasurer's bond, endorsed "assented to."

The report of the committee, appointed to inquire into the propriety of altering and amending the charter of the University of Maryland, was read the second time and concurred with.

On motion by Mr. Maxcy the following message was read:

By the House of Delegates, February 4, 1826.

Gentlemen of the Senate,

We propose, with the concurrence of your honourable body, to appoint a joint committee of both houses to proceed to Baltimore, and examine into the state and condition of the University of Maryland, to ascertain whether any alterations in the charter are necessary, and if so, whether the regents of the University are willing to assent to the same; and to report the information, which may be collected, to this general assembly. Messrs. _____ have been appointed on the part of this house, to join such gentlemen as may be named by your honourable house.

Mr. Maxcy chairman of the committee of ways and means, delivers the following report:
