cooperage altogether, and so far reduce the storage and outage, that the proceeds may only be adequate to pay for repairs, the salaries of inspectors and other necessary expenses.

A bill for the above mentioned purpose, will be prepared by the com-

mittee and laid before the house.

It has been thought expedient by the committee to call the attention of the general assembly to the laws relating to the treasury, which are deemed insufficient to regulate properly the administration of the money concerns of the state. They will therefore prepare a bill for the re-organization and establishment of the treasury department, and in due time lay it before the house.

Resolved, That the governor and council be and they are hereby authorised and requested, to cause such of said papers as are required by law to be recorded, to be registered as soon as may be, in proper books to be procured for that purpose; and that such books of registry, after they are completed, be deposit-

ed and remain among the archives of said office.

The bill to punish such persons as destroy indexes and pointers on public roads, was read the second time. Mr. Teackle moved to strike out the word "indexes" and insert "indicis." Determined in the negative. The bill was then passed.

The house adjourns until Monday morning 10 o'clock.
