The committee of grievances and courts of justice, to whom was referred so much of the executive message as relates to the distribution of two hundred copies of the fifth and sixth volumes of Harris and Johnson's reports, which were purchased by order of the legislature, ask leave to report—That the committee deem it advisable to distribute one hundred and twenty-two copies in the manner pointed out in the following resolution:

Resolved, That the governor and council cause the said reports to be distributed and forwarded as follows—To the court of appeals for each shore four copies, to the court of chancery one copy, to each county court three copies, to Baltimore city court two copies, to each orphans court one copy, to the general assembly eight copies, to the executive chamber one copy, to the land office of the eastern shore one copy, and to the land office for the western shore one copy, to the library of congress two copies, to each of the judges of the court of appeals and county courts one copy, to each of the judges of Baltimore city court one copy, to the chancellor one copy.

Resolved, That the other copies remain in the council chamber, subject to the future disposition of the legislature.
