The clerk of the senate returns the resolution in favour of the register of wills of Talbot county, and the resolution in favour of the collectors of Prince-George's county, severally endorsed 'assented to.'

The bill for the delivery of the will of Solomon Kitt; the further supplement to the act, entitled, An act declaring what shall be evidence in certain cases therein mentioned; the bill for the relief of Horace Morris, of the state of New York, severally endorsed 'will pass.' Ordered to be engrossed.

Also delivers a bill, entitled, An act concerning agents and factors; a supplement to an act, entitled, An act for amending and reducing into system the laws and regulations concerning last wills and testaments, the duties of executors, administrators and guardians, and the rights of orphans, and other representatives of deceased persons; a bill, entitled, An act relating to rights of dower; a bill, entitled, An act to alter and change the name of George Stiles Dew, a minor, of the city of Baltimore, to John Holland Barney; and the bill, entitled, An act to alter and amend the constitution and form of government of this state, so as to limit the duration of the sessions of the general assembly, severally endorsed 'will pass;' which were read.

And returns the additional supplement to an act, entitled, An act to incorporate the trustees of the Franklin academy or school in Baltimore county, endorsed 'will pass with the proposed amendments.' Ordered, That the amendments be the order of the day for Tuesday next.
