Mr. Stevens moved to strike out the words 'any fees that may be due to themselves or.' Determined in the negative.

Mr. Ridgaway moved to strike out the 2d section? Determined in the negative.

Mr. Boone moved to insert the words 'or constable,' after the word 'sheriff.' Resolved in the affirmative.

On motion by Mr. Barnes, That the following be added to the bill: "And be it enacted, That the provisions of this act shall not extend to or be enforced in Frederick county."

Mr. Kilgour moved to insert Saint Mary's county. Mr. Ridgaway moved to insert Queen Anne's. Mr. Edelen moved to insert Charles. And Mr. Kennedy moved to insert Washington. Which were severally negatived. When Mr. Kilgour moved to refer the bill to the next general assembly.
