

and of law, marked A, B, C and D, all which accompany and form a part of this report.

From the report of the committee of Regents, it appears that in pursuance of the act of 1812, the medical college previously incorporated, annexed to themselves the several faculties of law, divinity and of the arts and sciences, and thereby constituted the University of Maryland.

That each of the three faculties of physic, divinity and law, has seven members by the charter of incorporation; that the charter is not explicit as to the number of which the faculty of arts and sciences is to consist, but the actual number now belonging to it is six.
