Resolved in the affirmative and the bill sent to the senate.

The clerk of the senate returns the report and resolution relative to fisheries in Susquehanna river, endorsed "assented to."

Also the supplement to an act, entitled, A further supplement to an act empowering the levy court of Cecil county, at their discretion, to levy a sum of money to build a bridge over Octorara creek, at or near Samuel Rowland's store.

And the bill to authorise and empower the justices of the levy court of Saint Mary's county, to fix and regulate the rates of public inns, severally endorsed; "will pass." Ordered to be engrossed.

On motion by Mr. Kennedy, the following resolution was read:

By the House of Delegates, March 2, 1826.

Resolved, That the treasurer of the western shore be and he is hereby authorised and directed, to prepare and digest a proper system of revenue, calculated to secure the prompt payment of, and safe disbursement, of all public monies, and report the same to the legislature at their next session, together with such a bill as he may think necessary to carry into effect a proper system of revenue.

Mr. Chapman delivers the following report:

The committee upon special acts of assembly, to whom was referred the bill from the senate entitled, An act relating to insolvent debtors, report—That in the opinion of your committee, the said bill should pass with the annexed amendments: In the fifth section, second line, between the words "hereafter" and "filed" insert the word "be."

Insert the following as an additional section, after the 1st section in the bill:

And be it enacted, That upon any application by a citizen of another state, for the benefit of the several acts of assembly of this state, passed for the relief of insolvent debtors, the judge or judges, or commissioners of insolvent debtors, for the city and county of Baltimore, as the case may be, to whom such application is made, are hereby authorised and required, to extend to the petitioner the benefit of the said several acts, to the same extent that he would have been entitled had he been a citizen residing in this state for two years preceding such application, provided, that the judge or judges or commissioners, for the city of Baltimore, as the case may be, shall be satisfied that the petitioner did not come to this state with the intention of availing himself of the benefit of this act, or with a view of defrauding his creditors; and provided also,
