

On motion by Mr. Maxcy, the following resolution was read, assented to, and sent to the senate:

Resolved, That the treasurer of the western shore pay unto the order of Theodorick Bland, the sum of \$3,400, for his salary as chancellor, for the year ending on the 16th day of February 1826. And the salary of the present chancellor, as declared by a resolution passed at this session of the general assembly, shall be paid to him, quarterly, by the treasurer of the western shore, during the continuance of his commission, and no longer.

Mr. Rogerson delivers the following report:

The committee on pensions and revolutionary claims, to whom was referred the petition of Mrs. Barbary Riley, of the city of Washington, have had the same under consideration, and beg leave to report—That they are of opinion that she is not entitled to a pension, having produced no testimony, that she was the wife of captain William Riley, during the revolutionary war; they therefore recommend that she have leave to withdraw her petition.

The speaker laid before the house a report from the commissioners of the school fund for Harford county; which was read:

On motion by Mr. Maxcy, the following resolution was read:

The committee of ways and means, to whom was referred the memorial of Anna and William Baker, adm'rs. of William Baker, and others, praying that the state's agent for the eastern shore may be authorised to assign a certain judgment held by the state against Robert Wright, of Queen-Anne's county, begs leave to report—That the claims mentioned in the memorial are of long standing. That execution issued thereon in 1815, and since that time has been constantly pressed, but payment has never been made. In October last, the memorialists became the purchasers, at sheriff's sale, of Mr. Wright's farm, under one of the state's claims, but a part of one of the judgments not having been levied on said farm, was not paid off by the memorialists. On this portion the memorialists ask an assignment, provided within a certain time the amount of the same be paid and satisfied to the state's agent for the eastern shore.

The committee, inasmuch as by these means further coercive measures will be avoided, recommend the adoption of the following resolution:

Resolved, That the state's agent for the eastern shore be and he is hereby directed, to stay execution on a certain judgment of the state against Robert Wright, of Queen-Anne's county, and to assign the same to Anna Baker and William Baker, adm'rs. of William Baker, John Wroth, adm'r. of Kenven Wroth, and Rebecca Brice and Martha Brice, executrices of Richard Brice, provided the amount of the same be paid to said agent at the following times, and in the following manner, to wit. One half of said judgment, including debt, interest and costs, be paid to said state's
